




Gospel reflection Questions For This Week Gospel Passage: Matthew 20:1-16

St. John the Baptist thanks God for our Safe Parking Guests and our Knights of Columbus!

The Safe Guests Breakfast Program was conceived by Council 11780 as part of the Knights of Columbus "Leave No

Neighbor Behind" Program. The Breakfast Program provides a freshly cooked hot breakfast with coffee, twice a week to the SJTB Safe Parking Guests on Mondays and Wednesdays at 7:00 AM. Cooking and service is being performed by a small group of Knights on a rotating schedule.

Currently, due to COVID, breakfast is being served in togo-boxes and delivered to the picnic table that the guest share. Supplies for the Breakfast Program come from the Covington Storehouse, the Knights of Columbus Support Fund, and private donations. A canopy has been installed over the picnic table to provide some shelter. The next step would be to move the service to the benches that are in front of the entrance to the education center. There the guests would have more shelter from wind and rain.

the frontlines of the wildfires as part of a team of reservists from Joint Base Lewis-McChord. Thank you Dan! And you are in our prayers.



iVoteCatholic: During this second week, we focus on the Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers. In our Catholic tradition, work is more than just a way to make a living; work is one of the ways we participate in the ongoing work of creation in our world. Those who are responsible for the employment of people have a special responsibility to make decisions that uphold the dignity and safety of workers and their rights. Those rights include being able to earn fair wages, to have productive work, and to have a say in decisions that affect them, including the right to organize. Under this principle fall issues such as living wages, fair hiring practices, availability of job training/ skills, discrepancy in employment for women and minorities, and job availability for thriving not just surviving. World Day of Migrants & Refugees, September 27: 42% of all IDPs are located in Africa. Additionally, only 3 countries make up 42% of all IDPs globally. These are Colombia with 7.9 million IDPs, Syria with 6.1 million, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) with 4.5 million.

Save money by reducing food waste, which In the landfill generates a potent greenhouse gas (methane). The average U.S. family wastes \$1,600 of food each year. Use shopping lists to avoid duplicates and keep less food on hand. The "Best if Used by" dates on packages are NOT necessarily expiration dates ("Use-By" dates DO signify expiration).
