

Synod

Irene Cervantes is a member of our Parish Leadership Team. During our recent Synodal listening sessions, Irene frequently participated as a scribe. She partnered with another parishioner to write the Synodal summary St. John the Baptist sent to the Archdiocese. Irene reflects on her experience leading up to the writing of this summary below.



Before starting to write the Parish Synod Summary, I spent time in the Sanctuary. It was quiet. It seemed peaceful. However, I sensed that I was not alone. I was surrounded by the voices of our community and our parishioners;

voices that were written on the posters, which were on the wall waiting to be heard. I walked around reading, rereading, reflecting, and praying. At times a certain comment would stand out. I remembered I had heard it during a Listening Session. I would stop and picture that person. I would relive that moment and again feel the sincerity, the honesty, the hope, or the hurt. I heard love for our church. I heard joy and excitement. I also heard sadness and disappointment.

As I listened, I sensed that the responses were not coming from the top of their heads. The comments were coming from their hearts. Their ideas were formulated as though this was something they had been thinking of for a while. How could this be? The question had just been asked. I realized that people were taking this seriously: this is our church, this is our future. And people were hoping for change. Their answers were based on what mattered to them. There were many separate Listening Sessions, yet certain common themes began to emerge.

I continued to walk in the church that was now full of voices. I listened as I walked and prayed. I listened with respect. I listened with my heart. And my heart was full of gratitude. It was full of gratitude and humility at the task that was before us, not just for the present, but for the future as well. Not just for some, but for our entire community.

Throughout the Synod process, we started each Listening Session with a Prayer to the Holy Spirit. It was only by continuing that prayer and keeping in mind the question, "What steps does the Holy Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in journeying together?" that we could do justice to the voices of the community. It was in that spirit that Synod Summary has been written.

On Thursday, May 12, the **Finance Council** met to review the results of the April Financials and to review and approve the Fiscal Year (FY) 22/23 Annual Budget. The Budget was reviewed and approved by the Committee. The projected income for FY 22/23 is \$1,237,966.00 and expenses are projected to be \$1,289,304.00. The committee also discussed the need to add more members to the Finance Council. THE RIPPLE EFFECT OF MENTAL HEALTH

FAMILY:

- At least 8.4 million people in the U.S. provide care to an adult with a mental or emotional health issue
- Caregivers of adults with mental or emotional health issues spend an average of 32 hours per week providing unpaid care

COMMUNITY:

- Mental illness and substance use disorders are involved in 1 out of every 8 emergency department visits by a U.S. adult (estimated 12 million visits)
- Mood disorders are the most common cause of hospitalization for all people in the U.S. under age 45 (after excluding hospitalization relating to pregnancy and birth)
- Across the U.S. economy, serious mental illness causes \$193.2 billion in lost earnings each year
- 20.8% of people experiencing homelessness in the U.S. have a serious mental health condition
- 37% of adults incarcerated in the state and federal prison system have a diagnosed mental illness
- 70% of youth in the juvenile justice system have a diagnosable mental health condition.
- 8.4% of Active Component service members in the U.S. military experienced a mental health or substance use condition in 2019.
- 15.3% of U.S. Veterans experienced a mental illness in 2019 (31.3 million people).

WORLD:

- Depression and anxiety disorders cost the global economy \$1 trillion in lost productivity each year
- Depression is a leading cause of disability worldwide
