

#### Confirmation

On June 14, our parish will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with our youth.

Confirmation is one of the three sacraments of initiation. Together with Baptism and Eucharist, Confirmation makes us Catholic. And more than just a member of an institution, being Catholic means being joined to the Body of Christ, to be an image of Christ to others. We cannot accomplish that by human effort alone; it requires grace.

The grace of Confirmation roots us more deeply in our identity as children of God. It unites us more firmly to Christ. It increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us. It renders our bond with the Church more perfect. And it gives us a special strength to spread the faith in both word and action. (CCC 1303).

Confirmation is necessary in order to be a godparent or sponsor. It is strongly encouraged before entering into the Sacrament of Marriage. It is also required for certain ministries within the parish.

Normally, Confirmation is celebrated in the late middle school or high school years. However, many miss this sacrament in those hectic years. For adults, the Sacrament of Confirmation may be celebrated at any age.

If you are an adult who is not yet confirmed, is now the time to receive the grace of this sacrament? Adult preparation for the sacrament may begin after the summer. Contact our Pastoral Assistant for Faith Formation, Joan for more details <a href="mailto:joanw@sitbcc.org">joanw@sitbcc.org</a>.

### **Synod**

This week, **Bob Denney** of our Parish Leadership Team reflects on his experience of our Synodal process. He was one of the co-writers of the summary that St. John the Baptist sent to the Archdiocese.



In reflecting upon the St. John's Synod process, I wander to Luke's Gospel describing Jesus' appearance on the road to Emmaus. (Lk 24:13) We walk, yet we do not see. In that famous encounter, it was two apostles not recognizing the presence

of Jesus. However for us, throughout the Synod gatherings, our eyes were not blinded. A prayer was said, silence was observed, and our hearts openly welcomed the stirring of the Holy Spirit.

The presence of the Divine was abundantly clear during early discussions - that of one's experience of church. The joys, the difficulties, the wounds, and the insights were elicited through those church and faith experiences. Stories emerged of disappointment, anger, rejection, and uncertainty of one's role within the church's hierarchy. Emotions were stretched, but faith was not broken.

Through the darkness of those journeys, the Spirit guided hope. Dreams of an inclusive and compassionate church rang strong. Challenges were acknowledged and difficulties not shirked aside. All saw a path forward and were eager to be part of that change. Ideas flowed from everyone's lips. Challenges were captured and channeled into thought provoking opportunities. "We" and "us" and "our" were used to describe the church's future.

As Fr. Richard Rohr is fond of saying, "Light is less something you see directly and more something by which you see all other things." What I saw in the gatherings and discussions were God's light and love illuminating the words of all participants. From those words, steps will be taken to distill and act upon ideas and suggestions.

Our collective views have been offered to the Archdiocese. And all of that is good. Though, as I look upon the months-long journey, the blessing I most appreciate is the sharing of stories. We all have a story; we all come with a story. The sharing of those innermost thoughts, hurts, and dreams is truly a gift from an ever-loving God.

It is now our opportunity to not make this the last chapter of our journey but rather an introduction to a revived and vibrant church, where Christ's Second Commandment is lived out in our daily lives.
