

# **Pastor's Corner**

This past year was only the third time in my 39 years of priesthood that I experienced an Easter Vigil without any baptisms.

Have you invited anyone to church lately?

COVID may have played a role in that. On the other hand, maybe the invitation was never extended. That invitation often begins with the average Catholic in the pew. You are the ambassadors for the parish and for the Church. Others, who may be searching for God, might hear in your description of our faith community or see in your manner of life something that attracts their interest or awakens a longing in their hearts.

When talking with relatives, friends, or neighbors, is there a way to share something you value about our parish or about the Catholic Faith? It could be as simple as sharing the parish's value of caring for the environment or engagement in issues of social justice and compassion. Perhaps it is the experience of being part of a community that is important to you or the style of Catholic worship. Letting others know that you are Catholic and the positive influence this is for may be one way of helping others find Christ.

Sometimes a direct invitation can work. "I'm going to church this weekend; would you like to join me?" "Have you ever thought about becoming a Catholic?" You may be the only way God has to draw someone to the faith. When you see someone moving into your neighborhood, as you welcome them to the local community, might you ask, "Do you have a church community? Are you looking for one?" If they already belong to another denomination, you could still help them find where that denomination is located.

You may be the invitation someone needs to draw closer to Christ. Being that invitation might help you draw closer to Christ as well.

# # Annual Catholic Appeal


Thank you to all of you who have returned your Annual Catholic Appeal pledge. Your gift makes a difference to our brothers and sisters in all places in life.

# **Our SVdP Neighbors Need You!**



Jesus said, "Love your neighbor as vourself". How is your St John the Baptist SVdP conference living out that mission? Here's a recent story.

John and his family are refugees from Afghanistan. Through World Relief Organization (WRO), they found a home in Kent. WRO paid the first five months of their rent, and then John was to take over. But through some misunderstanding, John did not pay. So John and his family owed almost \$5000 in rent and were served a pay-or-vacate notice. With SVdP's \$500 plus pledges from SVdP's partners in the Kent area, John and his family were saved from eviction. Through partnering with other community agencies, St. John's SVdP conference helped a neighbor avoid being homeless.

# Celebrate World Day for Grandparents & Elderly on July 24, 2022

Pope Francis has established throughout the Church the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly (<u>laityfamilylife.va/content/laityfamilylife/en/amorislaetitia/iniziative-e-risorse/giornata-mondiale-e-anziani.html</u>) on the **fourth Sunday of July**, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

The announcement of this celebration coincided with the celebration of the Year of Amoris Laetitia Family, which began on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary, on March 19, 2021. It concluded at the World Meeting of Families in Rome in June 2022. The theme for this year's celebration is "In Old Age They Will Still Bear Fruit" (Ps. 92:15). The theme is meant to emphasize how grandparents are a gift both to society and the Church.
