

Pastor's Corner

Singing

St. Augustine said that music is a way for God to lead us to the realm of higher things. God dwells within each person, in the place where music takes its source. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops have written, "Thus, it is no wonder that singing together in church expresses so well the sacramental presence of God to his people" (Sing to the Lord, #2).

During COVID, when singing was limited, we had to participate internally to the singing done by a cantor, joining with our minds and hearts as we listened. Now, in addition to internal participation, we are returning to greater external participation, as we now can join our voices in song.

Once, in a former parish, when I was trying to encourage greater singing, a parishioner responded, "Well you don't sing everything. I don't see your lips move all the time." Upon further discussion, I discovered this person was referencing to those times when the Assembly was supposed to sing – not the presider. I had to explain that some of our singing is a part of a dialogue. There are different parts taken by the priest, the cantor, and the People. As presider, I do not sing the Great Amen or the memorial acclamation. That is the part of the Assembly. The rite is very specific as it states, "The People acclaim" as opposed to "The Priest says or sings." We are engaging in liturgy together.

As COVID restrictions on singing are being lifted, we will return to greater congregational singing. Be sure to take your part. We need your voice. The U.S. Bishops noted that, "The quality of our participation in such sung praise comes less from our vocal ability than from the desire of our hearts to sing together of our love for God" (#13).

Pass On The Good News

What good news? The Good News of Jesus Christ and our Catholic faith!

This fall, over 200 children and young people, preschool through grade 12, will sign up to learn more about Jesus and the Catholic faith. You can help them learn and grow in faith by becoming a catechist for Faith Formation. With classes offered Sunday mornings and evenings and Wednesday evenings you are almost sure to find a time that fits your schedule. As you nurture the faith of our young, you will learn and grow as well! As one long-time catechist put it, "I learn so much from the children!" We provide you with training, materials, and support. Each month the members of the One Parish, One Prisoner (OPOP) team, including our friend Chaz, spend some time reflecting upon a learning module. The first module we covered in July was on the Lost Art of Letter Writing, where the team delved into how letter writing can be Biblical in nature, noting how many of the New Testament letters were written while Paul was imprisoned.

We explored how those who are incarcerated can impart much wisdom from their lived experiences. The OPOP team members commenced writing physical letters to Chaz.

The second module the OPOP team covered for August was on Success, challenging our expectations of what might come from this experience. The module states: "Our primary goal is not to help our new friend become a 'productive member of society,' as that miserably utilitarian phrase goes... "Success" in this journey, if we have to use that word, is opening such relationships of embrace and trust. Success is learning how to be faithful. Success is mutual transformation."

We ask for your continued prayers for the OPOP team, especially Chaz, on this journey. We hope to provide monthly updates as this journey continues.


