

Ministry Spotlight

Sacristans: The Silent Servers

"To me, sacristans are an important part of the team of 'silent servers' who serve God and our parish at every Mass. It is a unique opportunity to meet and work with others, and to become more focused on the Mass itself," reflected a current sacristan at the weekend Masses. This sentiment is shared by other sacristans.

Annette Parker, a sacristan at the Life Teen Mass, said, "Being a sacristan has increased my faith. I am handling the consecrated hosts and wine, which I knew was important before, but now with being a sacristan, I see it as an honor. When I am at the tabernacle in the side chapel, sometimes I will see individuals or families deep in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. I am amazed and humbled to witness their profound spiritual faith, and this has deepened my faith. Of course I was a bit overwhelmed and nervous in the beginning, but now I have the rhythm and process down and can truly feel the sacred moments of the Mass."

"For me, being a sacristan has been very rewarding. I have become more focused on the various parts Mass and have enjoyed getting to know the many people involved in preparing for the celebration of Mass. Since I am a "Martha type" person, being a sacristan allows me to actively, yet prayerfully, serve the Lord," reflected Laura Rothschilds.

Laurie Moloney says she gets much more out of being a sacristan than she gives. "The graces of the Eucharist makes the role a blessing."

But we are very short of sacristans for most of the weekend Masses and need new people to volunteer at each of the Mass times, especially the 5:30 PM Saturday as well as the 9 and 11:30 AM Masses on Sunday.

Weekend sacristans set up the vessels, cloths, hosts and wine before Mass, bring the reserved consecrated hosts from the tabernacle to the altar and distribute consecrated low-gluten hosts during Communion, and return remaining consecrated hosts to the tabernacle after Communion. After Mass, sacristans distribute consecrated hosts to Eucharistic Ministers for the sick and homebound and then properly clean and store all the vessels and cloths.

The only requirement is that you are a confirmed, practicing Catholic, willing to share your time and talents about once a month for the Mass of your choice. We provide training and a detailed process that you can easily follow.

Making preparations for Mass as a sacristan gives me some focused time to also prepare myself spiritually for the celebration of the Mass. As someone who likes "doing" something, being a sacristan is ideal. I feel like I'm helping to make the Mass go smoothly for the celebrant, the altar servers as well as everyone in the congregation. Bringing the consecrated hosts from the tabernacle to the altar is a privilege.
