Pastor's Corner

Communion Under Both Kinds

After more than two and a half years, the chalice may once again be shared with the faithful. All restrictions on the sharing of the Precious Blood with the assembly have been lifted. As we have discovered throughout COVID, every person's comfort level is different and should be respected. People's readiness to receive from the cup will vary.

The Church teaches and believes that Christ is present, body and blood, soul and divinity, in the sacrament of his Body and Blood, and that Christ is fully present under the form of bread and under the form of wine. Thus, even when communion under both kinds is not possible, the presence of Christ is not diminished. However, "sharing in both Eucharistic species reflects more fully the sacred realities that the Liturgy signifies" When we receive under both kinds, "we obey the Lord's command and grow in the likeness of the Lord whose Body and Blood they both signify and contain"

There have always been concerns around sharing germs when we share the chalice. The Archdiocese has found no scientific evidence indicating a shared cup spreads the COVID-19 virus. Many dioceses have already resumed the sharing of the chalice and have not had issues with transmission of COVID-19. People are not required to receive, and those who wish to do so are not at a greater risk because close contact does not take place. The chalice is always optional, but it is important for the faithful to be able to partake of this fuller sign of Eucharistic sharing if they wish.

There is no mandated timeline for restoring the chalice to the assembly. It will be important to make all needed preparations before reintroducing it, including training additional Eucharistic Ministers, especially in the wiping and turning of the cup which makes it safer for people to receive.

On Point!

Have you ever wondered who opens the doors and turns on the lights to welcome you when you arrive for Mass? Have you wondered how the Mass is celebrated so smoothly each weekend with all the liturgical minister roles filled? We have our point people to thank for this. Each Mass has only one point person, so it is an extremely important position.

Being a point person is the first step in welcoming the community to the Mass. As I walk through the church, opening doors and turning on the lights, I think of all the people who will soon arrive to a friendly place. In addition, as I work to ensure that all the liturgical spots are covered, I am helping to ensure the Mass is as rich and meaningful for all in attendance. It is an honor to help people get as much out of the Mass as possible. Another benefit of being a point person is that I get to know a lot of people. It is wonderful to know the names of the people I am helping to welcome to the Mass.

Mary Peterson, Point Person at the 9 am Mass, says, "I'm kind of a 'behind the scenes' kind of gal, and Point Person is right up my alley. I get to assist my community without much fanfare. Some of the duties I cherish are:

- Ensuring that those who can't walk have the precious Body of Christ brought to them at their seat (I am assisted in this by the wonderful greeters).
- Ensuring the air quality is as good as it can be by engaging the air handlers and fans, so hopefully everyone is comfortable, and no one gets COVID because of poor ventilation.
- Ensuring all the lights are on, the doors are unlocked and open, the nursery is open, and live streaming is on.
- Ensuring the bathrooms are clean, and lights are on.
- Making sure all ministers are present and finding substitutes if necessary.

I've been doing this ministry for many years and hope to share my joy with new people who want to find a way to serve our community in this way."

Pat Defiesta is honored to be called as a disciple of Christ by being the Mass Point Person. Not only does she get to know the parishioners and ministers better, but she also gets to play an important role in making sure the smallest details of Mass get taken care of so everyone can worship in comfort.

Rose Racicot, Point Person at the Life Teen Mass, says "As point person, I get great joy out of coordinating ministers to make the liturgy come alive. The spirit works through me to invite parishioners to serve at Mass and engage with the community."




