Ministry Spotlight



So, what is a Eucharistic Minister, anyway? A Eucharistic Minister (EM) is more properly called an "Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion", which denotes someone like you and me, who assist the priest in administering Holy Communion during the Mass. Simply put, we help serve our faith family a meal.

The call to become an EM came to me about 20 years ago. I was one of those who arrived at church about a minute before Mass started or sometimes coming in during the entrance hymn. I knew I had to be better at being prompt for Mass. Being asked to become an EM was the answer. As I became more involved with this ministry, I found myself coming to Mass earlier and earlier, so I could be in the moment of being an EM. These quiet moments before Mass allow me to remember that Holy Communion is not only about receiving the body and blood of Chris but also about serving and being seated at the table with Jesus and my faith family.

I asked fellow EMs on what serving as an EM means to them. Kathy Kernan (EM for Saturday 5:30 pm Mass) said, "It is fun to get to know others who serve at Mass, but most importantly, it has enhanced my focus and gratitude for the amazing gift of Eucharist that God gives us." Susan Ravotti, an EM for the 9:00 am Sunday Mass says, "As I place the host into their hands, I feel as though my hands become the bridgework of God, and He uses my eyes to transfer His love into theirs. For me. it is a very warm and powerful moment that I share with the people I serve, and I absolutely love it." Sam Racicot, an EM for the 5:30 pm Life Teen Mass said. "When I present the Eucharist to my fellow parishioners, I take a moment and look into their eyes. In that moment, we connect and become the body of Christ. It is a very spiritual experience." For me, being an EM is an honor, to be called to serve a very special meal in the most sacred hour of the week.

If any of the testimonials above moves you, please don't hesitate to answer the call to become an EM. And if you are what I once was, flying in to Mass with the entrance hymn, maybe this is your chance to come to Mass early and reflect upon serving our faith family. The Burning Bush

Season of Creation 2022

During the Season of Creation, we invite you to bring up gifts of fresh produce to the crate on the altar. These gifts may be from your garden or store-bought. All donations of fresh produce will be

delivered to the Storehouse. Please remember to bring in your Season of Creation commitments to share with the community!

Improving our Waste Sorting: You might notice some new types of trash cans located throughout our Parish buildings. These new cans will help us sort our trash in ways that will increase the amount of trash going to local composting and recycling centers, while reducing the amount of trash going to King County landfills. Every time you use these cans, you will be contributing to the Stewardship of Our Common Home, which is planet Earth.

Our Parish uses Republic Services for waste pickup, so if you have Republic Services at home, the "rules" for sorting are the same. If not, we have posted signs near many of the trash cans to explain what type of trash goes in each can. In general:

- <u>COMPOST</u> is food and paper soiled with food, such as coffee filters and paper plates made of only paper. Compost is also used paper towels, which we are collecting in kitchen areas and rest rooms.
- <u>RECYCLE</u> is clean paper, aluminum and metal cans, plastic bottles and jugs, plastic food containers (rinsed clean), and plastic cups. No residual food, which attracts bugs and rodents.
- <u>TRASH</u> is everything else. When in doubt, it's trash.

Our parish can reduce its monthly trash bill significantly by reducing the size of our trash dumpster, and you may also be able to save money at home by doing the same thing. Think about the amount of trash you generate, and when you are shopping, consider buying things with less packaging waste. Also, reuse as much as you can. If you can downsize your trash can, your savings will really add up. SAVE THE PLANET AND SAVE MONEY TOO!

or more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has supported organizations that combat poverty and improve the lives of people in communities across the United States. From empowering immigrants in towns along the southern border to advocating for improved housing and educational opportunities in northern and midwestern cities, CCHD-funded groups tackle a wide range of economic and social justice challenges that affect local communities in rural and urban areas.


In areas of Tennessee where coal-mining operations and landfills have caused water pollution and other environmental damage, Statewide Organizing for Community eMpowerment (SOCM) works with governments and regulatory agencies to limit hazardous waste disposal in landfills and to require environmental cleanup as part of the permitting process for new business operations.

Environmental damage affects all of us, most especially low-income people who are affected by water pollution resulting from mineral extraction, lack of access to healthy foods in urban "food deserts," and natural disasters caused by climate change. The Church teaches that "the natural environment is a collective good, the patrimony of all humanity and the responsibility of everyone" (Pope Francis, Laudato Si', no. 95). Since the release of Laudato Si' in 2015, CCHD has invested more than \$4.3 million in organizations that work to protect the environment and combat pollution. When you support CCHD, you support organizations that work to protect the air, soil, and water for all the members of their communities.


