World Mission Sunday, October 23

In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. The Mission Sunday collection is always taken on the next to last Sunday during the month of October. That day is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity, so Christians the world over will recognize their common responsibility with regard to the evangelization of the world.

Our financial support enables the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of churches, and the work and witness of mission priests, sisters, and lay pastoral leaders. These missionaries provide food, education, and medical care to the most vulnerable communities throughout the world. Through their work, they reveal the compassionate heart of Jesus.

In addition to our partnership with these missionaries overseas, World Mission Sunday also calls us to see ourselves as missionaries, called to bring the Gospel to our corner of the world by the witness of our lives as well. The commission Jesus gave his disciples is given to us: "Go make disciples."

Ministry Spotlight



My husband I joined St. John the Baptist in 2018. We were married in the summer of 2019 and joined **Financial Peace University** (FPU) that fall.

Having the opportunity to be part of FPU could not have come at a better time. We bought a house, got married, and were pregnant with our first child all within six months! While we were dating and engaged, we had discussed finances and held very similar values in terms of giving, saving, and spending. But we didn't have a very clear idea on how to actually do those things and achieve our goals!

FPU was the roadmap we needed. Through the lessons, videos, and group discussions, we learned what steps to take as a newlywed couple and expecting parents to be able to achieve our goals. We were able to begin investing an appropriate amount into our retirements. We purchased insurance with the proper amount of coverage; we set up a college fund for our daughter; we were able to increase giving to our favorite charities; and we were able to make improvements on our home without going into debt.

Our family has continued to grow, and we welcomed our second baby, a son, in March 2022. I have been able to take time off of work and will return after his first birthday. We feel so blessed that I am able to stay home with our children during this season. This blessing is in part due to FPU.

Doing this work while our kids are still young has really allowed us to plan for many different aspects of the future. We would recommend FPU to anyone, but especially those with young children or those who are hoping to grow their families.

In this presentation, Father Michael Carson will explore the history of the last 200 years - tracing where the concept of Native boarding schools originated and how

these institutions were rooted in the sin of racism and have left a path of destruction through Native culture and peoples.

In the second part of the presentation, Father Carson will take what we have learned from St. George Residential School Tacoma history and develop some working ideas to promote healing and counter the historic trauma of boarding schools. 
