#### **Ministry Spotlight**



In October 2020, Pope Francis released his most recent encyclical *Fratelli Tutti: On Fraternity and Social Friendship.* It is fitting that the publication of this document, rooted in the building of relationship, occurred during Respect Life Month. In it Pope Francis writes, "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community" (*FT 116*).

This week we highlight the PREPARES ministry – a ministry committed to walking alongside families in need. In the past year a few of these families include a single mom fleeing an abusive partner, a grandmother caring for her young granddaughter, and a mom and dad who recently arrived to the US trying to navigate raising their children in a new culture without the support of the family left behind, for whose lives they now fear.

The ministry meets monthly to debrief the visits they have had with their various families. Sometimes there are tangible ways the volunteers are able to help, by providing some diapers or baby formula. Often the needs of the family exceed what a volunteer is able to provide. Those are the times where the beauty of this ministry shines. Walking with a mom or dad or grandparent, loving their children and letting them know they are not alone in their journey.

#### Plant Trees!



They clean our air, protect our drinking water, and provide food and habitat for animals. Studies show they even improve our mental health.

Trees also absorb the CO<sup>2</sup> that contributes to global warming and release oxygen back into the air.

In one year, an acre of mature trees absorb the amount of CO<sup>2</sup> produced by a car driven 26,000 miles. Planting trees also helps prevent soil erosion, increases land fertility, and can add value to your property. Trees that provide shade can also significantly reduce your energy bills. When selecting trees, choose native types to support local wildlife. Spring and Fall can be good times to plant.


