### **Christmas Always Happens**

In times of war and in times of peace; in times of prosperity and during economic hardship and crisis; when families can gather and when families are separated - Christmas always happens. The experience of Christmas or the feeling of Christmas may vary due to the circumstances of life. Maybe, the greater the hardship, the greater the hope of Christmas shining through.

Remember that first Christmas came amidst political upheaval, in a country occupied by a foreign army. Society was deeply divided between those who collaborated with the Romans and those who wanted to fight them. Roman taxation reduced most to poverty. Because of a government edict, a young couple, the mother pregnant with her first child, had to close up the carpenter shop and leave home and relatives at a time they needed them most and travel to register for a census. There, alone in a stable, Christmas happened. Hope arrived with the sound of a newborn baby crying.

God had become one of us. God had entered into human suffering. And God continues to enter into our suffering. It is there that God often invites us to a deeper relationship. The hope of Christmas is realizing how near God is to us, how close God wants to be with us.

Amid the challenges and struggles of life, Christmas always happens. Let Christmas happen for you. God desires to be close to you, especially in your hardships and suffering. God proved that when he entered human suffering in the manger that first Christmas and again when he accepted that cross to suffer for us till he could suffer nor more. But the story does not end with suffering; it ends with resurrection, with hope. Above all, may your Christmas be filled with hope.

### **Ministry Spotlight**



Simbang Gabi, which means "Evening Mass," is a Filipino Christmas tradition consisting of nine novena Masses in preparation for Christmas Day. It begins on the 16<sup>th</sup> of December and ends at midnight on the 24<sup>th</sup>.

In the olden days, these evening Masses were celebrated at dawn, when the roosters crow; hence, the name *Misa de Gallo* or "Mass of the Rooster." This was done for practical reasons, as Filipinos then were mainly farmers or fishermen. The early schedule allowed them to hear Mass before they started their daily work. Thus, at daybreak, church bells rang, and families would walk or ride *carabao* (water buffalo) sleds with their *parols* (star lanterns) to their local churches. After Mass, the parishioners would revel in the beauty of the *Belen*, an artistic tableau of the Nativity Scene, and enjoy a variety of delicacies being sold at the churchyard, such as *bibingka* (rice cakes), *puto bumbong* (steamed glutinous rice), hot *pandesal* (breakfast rolls), and coffee or *salabat* (ginger tea).

The *Simbang Gabi* tradition continues not only in the Philippines but also in many overseas Roman Catholic Filipino communities. Today, here in the United States, it is often celebrated any time between 5pm - 8pm instead of dawn in order to accommodate the needs of the community members. But no matter the place, time, or language this revered Filipino tradition is celebrated or observed, it never fails to reawaken the Christmas spirit in everyone. It remains to be a tradition that effectively promotes strong camaraderie among Filipinos through a collective effort of prayer, fellowship, and charity. Truly, the *Simbang Gabi*, in its very essence, reflects the solid unwavering faith and devotion of the Filipino people.

With this, we, the Filipino-American (Fil-Am) Group of St. John the Baptist, are happy to invite and share with you this rich and meaningful tradition. We hope to see you in this year's *Simbang Gabi* on **December 17 at 5:30 pm**. Reception will follow after the Mass.
