We Are the Light of the World



As an amateur astronomer, I have seen the light of distance stars, galaxies, and nebulas magnified in amazing ways when I look through my telescope. I wouldn't be able to see these wonders of God's creation in quite the same way with the naked eye. Just as it's difficult to see fully God's great light in our dark world, Jesus calls us to be the telescope and bring His light into the world.

"Through baptism, we not only receive this light, but we become the light". This is represented at baptism when the godparent lights a candle from the Easter candle, which represents the light of Christ at the Easter Vigil. So how do we keep this light burning and how do we bring it to the world?

Isaiah tells us in today's first reading that if we give bread to the hungry and satisfy the afflicted, then our light shall break forth like the dawn (*Is* 58:8). When we bring God's mercy to others, Jesus' light shines through our lives and, in turn, draws others into the Light of Christ. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us we are the light of the world, and He calls us to let that light shine forth to all (*Mt* 5:13-14).

Here at St. John the Baptist we have many ministries that bring the light of Christ to the world. There's everything from St. Vincent de Paul ministry, Safe Car Parking, Creation Care, and PREPARES to serving as a liturgical minister at Mass. Monthly Council and Commission Meeting Report

On January 12, St. John the Baptist's Facilities and Grounds Commission met, discussing the electrical work completion for the air conditioning, the kitchen garbage disposal, and potential projects for the 2023 ACA rebate - especially given recent Archdiocesan safety recommendations. There is a possibility of applying for a FEMA Non-Profit Security Grant through the federal government. A list of potential Boy Scout Eagle projects is maintained.

On January 19, St. John the Baptist's Finance Council met to review the parish financial statements. Currently St. John the Baptist has a **net income** (surplus) \$47,582 as of December 31, 2022 because of the remaining PPP funds paid for payroll, and we are not paying for a youth minister. Council members reviewed stewardship pledge results and will start the budget process in February, when they expect to have a more accurate view of expected revenue for Fiscal Year 2023/24. Revenue is expected to decrease slightly. Members learned of the Partners in the Gospel initiative of the Archdiocese and discussed potential fiscal effects.
