Feast of Divine Mercy

This Sunday is the feast of *Divine Mercy*, one of the most recent feasts established by the church. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II established the feast and canonized Sr. Faustina Kowalska, whose visions of Jesus in the 1930's included the image we refer to as *Divine Mercy*.

In his homily on that Sunday, Pope John Paul II referred to the same gospel from John we read this week, when Jesus appears to his disciples, breathes on them, and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Pope John Paul said, "Before speaking these words, Jesus shows his hands and his side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in his heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity. From that heart Sr Faustina Kowalska will see two rays of light shining and illuminating the world: 'The two rays', Jesus himself explained to her one day, 'represent blood and water.'" (*Diary,* Libreria Editrice Vaticana, p.132).

Blood - the blood of sacrifice, his life that he shares with us at Eucharist; Water - the water of Baptism.

Blood and water. When else, dear friends, are blood and water poured out?

In the words of Julian of Norwich, 14th Century Christian mystic: "We know that all our mothers' bearing is [bearing of] us to pain and to dying: and what is this but that our Very Mother Jesus, He, All-Love, [bore] us to joy and to endless living? Thus He sustaine[d] us within Himself in love; and travailed, unto the full time that He would suffer the sharpest throes and the most grievous pains that ever were or ever shall be; and died at the last." (*Revelations of Divine Love*, Harvard College Library 1901, p.150)

And so are we "born again" in love and mercy.

Question: Is this simply expanded clustering?

Answer: To enable and support parishes in this renewal effort, Partners in the Gospel uses a fundamentally different approach to the current clustering structure.

The parish family is a temporary step on the way to becoming one parish. A comprehensive parish support plan is in development as part of this process. This support plan will include a newly formed group of liaison staff, employed and funded by the Chancery, who will partner with the pastor in guiding the parish family through the process of becoming one parish. In addition, many tools and resources are in development that will help support parishes every step of the way, including detailed handbooks for navigating prayer and worship, missionary discipleship, administration and finance, governance and leadership.

Our parish's Welcome Circle has been blessed to wrap around Alina, as she settles into life in the United States, A skilled seamstress, she was able to use her talent to create several costumes for the

recent play at Maple View Middle School, where one of her Welcome Circle members, Cheri, oversees the drama department. Alina has found a rich faith community in Federal Way, at a church with a large Ukrainian population and has recently begun working at a restaurant in Black Diamond, where she has been able to utilize her knowledge of the Polish language. At this point, Alina is on the verge of securing a driver's license (she was a licensed driver in Ukraine), and is in need of a working vehicle (automatic) to be able to go between Kent (where she is living), Black Diamond, and Federal Way. St. John the Baptist is also discerning forming a second Welcome Circle. As the conflict in Ukraine endures, the list of individuals and families seeking safety and stability continues to grow. Many of these individuals have been displaced multiple times within their country, as different towns and villages become unsafe to stay and others seek refuge in neighboring countries. While the war rages on in Europe, the United States has also opened up the possibility to sponsor individuals and families from four additional countries: Cuba, Haiti, Nicaragua, and Venezuela. Residents of these five countries are able to enter the United States via a process known as Humanitarian Parole - an option to stay in the United States legally for two years. The Archdiocese of Seattle is hoping to continue equipping individuals and parishes to welcome refugees into our community, seeing Jesus in their faces, and being Jesus' hands and feet.
