## Pastor's Corner



### **Parish Consultative Bodies**

When people tell me that they think being a pastor must be difficult, I like to remind them that the job of the laity is much more challenging. All I have to do is take care of a parish. You, the laity, have to transform the world! Even though I think I have the easier job, I still need a lot of help. Councils and Commissions help me, and the parish staff care for the parish community and live out the mission Christ entrusted to us.

The Archdiocese recommends people serve in councils and commissions for a specific term, usually three years, renewable once. One should only serve on one council or commission at a time. This means there is a constant rotation of new people on the various consultative bodies. Therefore, there is ample opportunity to serve.

The process for selection of new members begins with nominations. Suggestions for candidates are surfaced from existing commission members, from the parish staff and – at times - from the parish at large. Sometimes a commission needs a certain expertise. Sometimes it needs new members to help it better reflect the make-up of the parish.

During April and May, we will have a nomination process. I am asking you to nominate people who think would benefit the various councils and commissions. Maybe your spouse needs an evening away from the house once a month. Maybe one of your parish friends has a particular talent or interest that the parish needs. You could even nominate yourself.

Those who are nominated will be invited to an evening of discernment, to look at the role and purpose of the consultative bodies and to see if their gifts and talents match what the councils and commissions need.

Please be thinking of people you could nominate. If nominated, please consider serving. The consultative bodies of our parish are: The Parish Leadership Team (Pastoral Council), the Finance Council, Life, Justice and Peace Commission, The Faith Formation Commission, the Facility & Grounds Commission, the (new) Liturgy Commission, and the Stewardship and Evangelization Commission.

- Partners in the Gospel Core Team comprised of co-leads;
- Oversight Committee a diverse group of lay leaders, priests, a religious sister, a deacon, and our superintendent of Catholic Schools;
- Presbyteral Council made up of priests elected by each of the 10 deaneries who advise and consult with Archbishop Etienne:
- Partners Edge a research consulting firm that has helped other dioceses work through similar planning efforts;
- Parish family liaisons will be hired and trained by the Archdiocese of Seattle;
- You! We are asking for feedback and input from all employees and Catholics in the Archdiocese of Seattle in Fall 2023.

## **Annual Catholic Appeal 2023 Begins**

"Give, and it will be given to you." Luke 6:23 is the theme of this year's Annual Catholic Appeal, and this weekend kicks off the 2023 Campaign. The Annual Catholic Appeal funds ministries and services for your local Catholic community across Western Washington. This combined effort of parishes and missions ensures the availability of outreach ministries, education, faith formation, administration services for parishes, and much more! You should have received Archbishop Etienne's in-depth letter this week, highlighting the ministries that support our communities.

This year, our parish has set a **goal of \$117,416.00**. Across the Archdiocese the average gift was \$497. **All gifts received over our goal will be returned to the parish to replenish our in-parish assistance fund.** Please prayerfully consider how you can participate in helping our parish be a light to others.



# SB 5280 Clergy Mandatory Reporting and Maintaining the Clergy Penitent Privilege

SB 5280 is a bill requiring that clergy be mandatory reporters for child abuse and neglect. The bishops of WA state continue to support clergy as mandatory reporters, at all times and in all places, except when the information has been obtained during the sacrament of reconciliation.

SB 5280 passed the WA House of Representatives a couple of days ago, and unfortunately, now includes an amendment which removes the clergy-penitent privilege. SB 5280 now goes back to the Senate for passage or not, so it is time to persuade Senators to vote against this amended bill. Our parish is in a "swing legislative district," meaning that senators may be sensitive to freedom of religion issues if they hear from enough voters from their district. Along with the Washington State Catholic Conference (WSCC), Father Bill asks that you please email and call your senator today through the WSCC's quick Action Alert at wacatholics.org/be-an-advocate/action-center to make your voice known, stating that the clergy penitent privilege must be preserved and protected.
