Pastor's Corner

Love Your Neighbors and Pray For Those Who Persecute You



It is impossible to paint the gay and lesbian community with one broad, brush stroke. There is great diversity and many differences.

One very tiny group, which has been in the news lately may seem to be mocking Christianity and labeled by some as a hate group and anti-Catholic. They may evoke dismay or anger for those who love our Catholic faith. But remember the words of Jesus in Matthew's gospel: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute

you." (Matthew 5:44). In the same section of the Gospel, Jesus warns against anger. But I say to you, "Whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." (Matthew 5: 22). This is a challenging command from the Lord, especially when it seems someone is attacking what we hold dear. But if we respond only in anger, we may be abandoning the very faith we hold dear.

Nowadays, most people know someone who identifies as part of the LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning)+ community. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us how we should treat them. "They must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity" (#2358). That is the official teaching of the Church. We may not agree with some of their choices or lifestyle, but it does not lessen the respect, compassion, and sensitivity deserved by every child of God and every human being.

Question: How will priests be selected for the new parish family?

Answer: As with all priest placements, the Priest Personnel Board (PPB), made up of priests and Chancery leaders, makes recommendations to Archbishop Etienne. Each priest will have an individual conversation about their desires and how they would like to serve in the future - either as a pastor, a parochial vicar, or in a different supportive role.

June 20 is World Refugee Day



This week we celebrate World Refugee Day in an effort to recognize our sisters and brothers, who have been displaced by crisis and to pledge our support for their safe refuge, relief, and recovery. A refugee is a person who has been forced to flee his or her country

because of a well-founded fear of persecution, conflict or violence. According to the United Nations, every minute 20 people leave everything behind to escape war, persecution or terror (un.org/en/observances/ refugee-day). An increasing number of people have been displaced by climate change, disasters, population growth, economic inequality and conflict. As of mid-2022, there are more than 32 million refugees worldwide (unhcr.org/refugee-statistics/) including 5.4 million people from Ukraine. Worldwide, 103 million people have been forcibly displaced from their homes. More than 30,000 people are displaced every day. Nearly 14 million girls and boys under the age of 18 are refugees, accounting for more than 40% of the refugee population. For every three children who live outside their countries of birth, one is a child refugee. (Source: Catholic Relief Services)

Here at St. John the Baptist we are making space for those leaving unstable situations through our Welcome Circle efforts. A Welcome Circle consists of parishioners, who wrap around an individual or family entering into the United States through a process called Humanitarian Parole. This year, our Welcome Circle has been accompanying Alina, whose family had already resettled in the Seattle area from Ukraine. We are hoping to expand our Welcome Circle efforts to sponsor an additional individual or family. At this point, the Archdiocese is able to welcome individuals from Ukraine, Haiti, Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela. Our parish has received a generous grant from the Archdiocese of Seattle to pursue these efforts. We are able to accept items until the last Mass this Sunday, the 18th. Please do <u>not</u> just drop off items that create more work for our already exhausted volunteers. Remember, that not all items can be accepted. Please do <u>not</u> bring items containing chemicals, large appliances, helmets and used safety gear, or items that are broken, shredded, stained, or intimate. If it's broken, we can not resell it. Please be mindful of that.

Partners in the Gospel Retreat Held on June 10

About 63 members of St. John the Baptist gathered on Saturday, June 10 under the leadership of Fr. Bill and Joan Williamson to consider the work of the Holy Spirit in the founding of our parish, in the history of the Archdiocese, and in the initiative of the Archbishop who is asking nearly all parishes to merge into parish families by July 2024.

Fr. Bill shared a handful of statistics from the "Current Reality Report" which is available on the Archdiocesan website Partner's page: <u>archseattle.org/partners/</u>. These statistics form a large part of the reasoning behind the impetus to merge parishes.

After lunch, members of the parish leadership team, **Bob Denney** and **Trish Hansen**, presented the new parish priorities for feedback before they are officially adopted. Those are currently available on our website bulletin page in the June 4 edition of the bulletin.

There is a timeline on the right wall of the sanctuary. We encourage all parishioners to write their names and dates they became a member on one of the white stickers and place them on the timeline. This provides a visual of when we came together as a worship family.
