Pastor's Corner

Let Us Sing Together



I recently read an article in the Washington Post entitled, "Singing is good for you. Singing with others may be even better." The article cites studies that linked singing in choirs to reduced stress hormones and increased cytokines, proteins that can boost the body's ability to fight serious illness. Studies have also found a connection between generally singing with lessened anxiety, stimulated memory, increased lung capacity, and an easing of postpartum depression.

It is not a surprise that singing is good for one since we believe we are made by God to sing. In their document on music in divine worship, the U.S. Bishops wrote, "God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. God dwells within each human person, in the place where music takes is source. Indeed, God the giver of song is present whenever his people sing his praise." (#1).

Every Sunday we have the opportunity to sing together. It is good, both for our physical health and spiritual well-being. It also strengthens us as a community of faith, as we gather to worship our loving God.

What Are Those Yellow Chair Covers For?

Have you noticed those yellow-gold chair "thingies" with a pointed end sticking out on some chairs during Mass? These are our new chair covers to help our Eucharistic Ministers locate someone wanting communion brought to them. If you would like Holy Communion brought to you, please ask a greeter before Mass to give you a yellow-gold chair cover.

Place these covers over your chair back with **the triangle facing towards the aisle**, so it can be spotted easily.

It would also help the Eucharistic Ministers have easier access if the person who needs Holy Communion brought to them sit at the seat closest to the aisle.

A New Commission is Born

On Thursday, July 13, the new *Liturgy Commission* held its inaugural meeting. Its overall purpose is to advise and support the pastor on the spirituality and prayer life of the parish community.
