

# Liturgy Commission September Meeting

St. John the Baptist's music coordinator, *Luis Diaz de Leon*, gave the commission a brief review of music in the Mass in the past 120 years. Vatican II music has been an integral part of full and active participation in the Mass.

The commission reviewed and amended the Liturgy Commission Charter. Two officers were approved: *Mary Syslo* Chair, and *Scott Gilyeat* Vice Chair.

The commission will review several liturgical documents as preparation for our goal of evaluating all four Masses. This includes *Meeting Christ: Exploring the Liturgy, The General Instruction of the Roman Missal,* Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter *Desiderio Desideravi, and Sacrosanctum Concilium* from Vatican II.

**Caution: Speed Bumps Ahead** 

You may have noticed the speed bumps that **David Aldous**, our Facility Steward, is installing in the parking lot. These speed bumps also double as parking curbs, because they are safer than actual curbs and provide greater visibility and a lower profile.

Thanks to our 2022 Annual Catholic Appeal rebate funds, we are able to install these speed bumps to reduce the number of late night "donut drivers," who speed through the lot and put our Safe Car Parking guests at risk, among other things.
