Advent Gospels



The season of Advent begins next week. On the four Sundays of Advent, the Catholic lectionary presents a series of Gospel readings that prepare for the celebration of the birth of Christ. The Sunday Advent readings all rotate on a three-year cycle, but they always follow the same pattern. This Advent, we begin reading from the Gospel of Mark.

The Gospel for the First Sunday of Advent always tells of the reign of Christ at the end of time. It echoes the theme of this Sunday, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. Advent starts with the message that we await the second coming of Christ. This entire season is not just a reminder of a past birth but an anticipation of future glory.

The Second and Third Sundays of Advent always have Gospel readings about John the Baptist. John proclaims the nearness of the kingdom of God and serves as the prophet who bridges the Old and New Testaments. John foreshadows Jesus in his birth, his preaching, and his death. John's message on these two middle Sundays of this season inspires us to follow Christ. The Fourth Sunday of Advent always tells part of the story that just precedes the birth of Christ. These familiar episodes set the stage for the story of Christmas.

The Gospel readings of the four Sundays of Advent come to us in reverse chronology. We start with the end of time. We continue to the period when Jesus was an adult. We end in the days before his birth. Like a funnel, Advent opens with a giant theme, the grandness of Christ the King, and it ends with a humble and poor child lying in a Bethlehem manger.

Parish Leader Team Meeting Update

The Parish Leadership Team met on November 8, and reviewed the parish listening sessions for Partners in the Gospel. While there was the expected anxiety, most were able to get to a place of hope and positive expectation. Members who participated in the sessions were impressed with the quality of listening they experienced. They acknowledged the need to keep the parish updated in the process.

The team also looked at how the parish priorities will be implemented. These priorities were based on the parish listening sessions for the synod. The parish staff and the commissions will be focusing on one or two of those priorities. Staff chose the priorities of "accompanying all on this journey of faith" and "offering healing and hope to those hurt or wounded by the Church." Staff also recommended to the Parish Leadership Team that the parish establish a new Women's Commission to address the priority of "Recognizing, respecting, and being enriched by the experiences and perspectives of women." The Team reviewed a possible charter for a women's commission and recommended establishing it.

The team also reviewed the process for determining the use of the Annual Catholic Appeal Rebate. They recommend the proposal be tied into the parish priorities.



As we draw closer to Christmas, you will see the Giving Tree Ministry come to life. In collaboration with the St. Vincent de Paul Ministry, the annual Giving Tree helps bring Christmas joy to families who are facing difficult and challenging times. Starting this week, the Giving Tree with tags will be placed in the narthex, and parishioners can generously begin bringing in gifts that will be used in our Giving Tree Store on Tuesday, December 19.


We Welcome Family & Friends

THRESHOLD BIBLE STUDY

The method of Threshold Bible Study is rooted in the classical tradition of lectio divina, an ancient yet contemporary means for reading the Scriptures reflectively and prayerfully. Reading and interpreting the text (lectio) is followed by reflective meditation on its message. The reading and reflecting flows into prayer from the heart.

Advent is a time for new understanding, for putting different pieces of God's revelation together so as to see the divine plan more clearly. We listen to the words of the ancient prophets, to the wisdom of Jesus, to the stories of his birth and infancy, and we make connections between them. Then we connect those truths to our own lives and our contemporary world and see ways God is acting anew, ways God continues to reveal the coming of Jesus to us today.
