## A Night to Celebrate

*Simbang Gabi,* which translates to Night Mass, is a cherished Filipino tradition and is celebrated with great joy and devotion by our Filipino American (Fil-Am) community at St. John the Baptist. Its roots lie deep in the Filipino culture, and the Fil-Am is proud to share this beautiful Filipino tradition and its rich heritage with everyone.

The highlight of the event is the Eucharistic celebration, accompanied by a beautiful procession of *parols* (lanterns), as featured on our bulletin cover. The *parols* symbolize the star that guided the Three Wise Men to Bethlehem.

## **Update on Facilities Projects**

The St. John the Baptist Facilities Commission met Thursday, December 14, and reviewed progress on the last two Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) rebate projects.

There is a gate ready to install at the south driveway. It will be open during weekend masses and church office hours when school is open. We need volunteers to open and close the gate.

There are six more speed humps to install. Additionally, the access gate to the neighborhood east of the church is ready to install.

We have also purchased paint for the sanctuary bathrooms (2020 project). **Parishioners are invited to** help paint the bathrooms on Friday, December 29 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

We are obtaining bids from plumbers to replace the faucets, which were donated by a parishioner, in the McMullen Center bathrooms. Bids will include upgrading the plumbing fixtures and piping around them. Another plumbing project is fixing a leaking valve in the baptistery pump room.

Also discussed is the new ACA project, which is fencing around the retention ponds to provide safety. A rough estimate is about \$33,000. Our goal is to better understand the requirements before accepting a bid.

We will also be removing two dangerous trees on the church property. With the help of our volunteer, who works in wetland remediation, we plan to replace nuisance trees with about eight cedar or evergreen trees.

A separate sheet describing their mission and the items they most need is included with this form. Bring your donations with you to the retreat and get a free raffle ticket!

We will have two raffle baskets at the retreat. Tickets are \$1 each and all proceeds will also go to our St. Vincent de Paul chapter food bank.

If you haven't been to the retreat in a while, this is a reminder that for only \$15 per day you get 11-12 hours of uninterrupted time to work on your projects, PLUS dinner (and breakfast on Saturday), and you can still leave your supplies here overnight in our locked building. No hauling stuff back and forth! Your assistance with cleanup after meals and at the end of the retreat on Saturday is appreciated.
