St. John the Baptist Women's Commission

One of the strong concerns we heard during our parish synod listening sessions in January and February of 2022 centered on the role of women in the Church. The Parish Leadership Team incorporated that concern in our new parish priorities, which states:

We recognize, respect, and are enriched by the experiences and perspectives of women and those who are marginalized or underrepresented.

To help us live out this priority, the parish staff recommended, and the Parish Leadership Team has endorsed, the formation of a St. John the Baptist Women's Commission. The purpose of this Women's Commission is to support, empower, and form Catholic women in spirituality, leadership and service. The areas of focus will be:

- Mentoring, formation, discussion, and sharing;
- Opportunities to recognize and to involve women in leadership and ministry to the Word, Altar, and Service; and
- Form liaisons with other regional, national, and universal groups of Catholic women so that our parish can advocate for the voice of women.

Are we listening correctly to the parish? The test will be in parishioners' desire to be a part of this commission, either in roles of leadership or in the various activities that the commission will support. In January, we will begin recruiting for this new commission, which is open to both men and women.

Does this announcement spark something exciting in you? If so, please plan on attending an information session after the first of the year. Together, let us build something from the ground up.

Ministers Needed for Pastoral Care to the Homebound

Those who carry Holy Communion to the sick and homebound continue the community's act of worship in the Mass. You bring the Body of Christ that is present in the Mass to them, both in the form of the Eucharist and in form of the community. For the sick and homebound, the receiving of Communion is not only a privilege but also a sign of support and concern shown by the St. John the Baptist community for its members who can't attend Mass.

Pastoral Care also is a ministry of presence. Simply being present and listening to those who cannot attend Mass is a powerful ministry. At St. John the Baptist, we have ministers who take communion to the sick and homebound, and those who visit, listen, and pray with them in the form of words and music.

We currently have a critical need for more pastoral care ministers. Our community is aging, and many more people have requested communion than we have ministers who can take it to them.


We Welcome Family & Friends



Thank you to everyone who provided input and feedback on the parish families during the recent public consultation phase of Partners in the Gospel.

More than 800 people provided comments online, while nearly 140 parishes and missions hosted in-person sessions in several languages including English, Spanish, Vietnamese and Q'anjob'al, a Mayan language indigenous to Guatemala. In total, the Archdiocese of Seattle received more than 700 input session reports resulting in more than 3,000 pages of input.

Overall, the sessions were fruitful. Staff, lay leaders and parishioners listened to the Holy Spirit and provided their input on their proposed parish families.

Over the past few weeks, all collected input - by notetakers during the in-person sessions and from the online feedback form - was sorted by parish family. Each set of parish family data was read by two people who wrote a synthesis including any proposed changes, concerns and hopes for the new parish family.

This synthesized reports, along with the raw input data, were used by the Oversight Committee, the Presbyteral Council and the Partners in the Gospel team to inform the next draft of proposed parish families. Specifically, of the 61 proposed parish families, 25 were recommended for changes based on this recent consultation.

Public Input Phase results in changes to 25 draft parish families

There will be a second round of consultation with staff and parishioners with these 25 proposed parish families before a final recommendation is submitted to Archbishop Etienne at the end of the year. The final parish families are expected to be announced in early 2024.

A Parish Family Feedback Report of public input was released on November 16, 2023 with a letter from Archbishop Etienne, thanking everyone who participated in the public input process. Read Archbishop Etienne's letter and Parish Family Feedback Report online at archseattle.org/partners.

What do you hope for?

Here's what your fellow Catholics wrote online during the public consultation phase:

- Hope that the younger people will be motivated to serve the church and answer the call to the priesthood/religious life.
- We hope it serves as a wake-up call about the difficult temporal realities the Church faces in Western Washington in the present context. We hope there is genuine renewal through the process, though we admit to a certain trepidation that it will be disruptive to many people's habits of Church attendance and the routines which support a life of faith.
- My hope is that we focus on the key elements of our faith love God and love one another.
 Some of the wrangling over the less important part of our faith serve to distract us from loving one another as Christ loved us.

"What do I want for my children's children?"

Not a 20 person Mass, not pastors overworked, but rather a fully engaged parish. This isn't about us, but about everyone.
