Not only did it give me a strong start in my education, but it also fostered a bond between my parish and my family and taught me to love my Catholic faith. I believe our Catholic schools are valuable and effective tools for nurturing faith in families and in children. Unlike state-run schools, our school helps educate the whole child: intellectual, spiritual, and moral. Standards set and achieved by Catholic schools are well known and highly respected. The high quality of instruction in our schools, innovative approaches to the use of the latest technology, and a challenging curriculum prepare our students for every educational and vocational challenge they will face as the years go by. Our Catholic schools also respect the role of parents and work in close collaboration with them.

While our parish does not have a school, some of our parishioners attend <u>Holy Family School</u> in Auburn or <u>St. Anthony School</u> in Renton. Our parish tries to assist these families, helping to make up the difference between in-parish and out-of-parish tuition. The cost per pupil in our Catholic schools is less than in the state-run schools. However, those state-run schools are supported by federal, state, and local taxes. It is our parents who make the sacrifice to be able to send their children to Catholic schools.

This is Why We Pay for Insurance

On the night of Sunday, January 14, 2024, and after a weekend of night temperatures in the single digits and windchills of below 0°, our Facility staff person, *David Aldous*, received a phone call from the Fire Department that the church alarm had been triggered. Upon arrival at the church, he discovered that the sprinkler system, which triggered the alarm, was unloading a few thousand gallons of water into St. John the Baptist's (SJTB) narthex and sanctuary. Water saturated the carpet as far as the nursery on one end and outside the vesting sacristy on the other.

Yes, SJTB has insurance. Unfortunately, insurance policies also come with deductibles, specifically to the tune of \$25,000. Damage is estimated to be well over \$100,000.

St. John the Baptist's Financial Health

Our net income and facility expenses reflect our use of the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) rebate to install parking lot improvements. We do not count ACA rebates received until it is used next year. We are nearly \$40,000 short in expected stewardship giving but have kept expenses down this year, particularly by not being not fully-staffed.

The Discernment Process for Partners in the Gospel Continues

Based on the input from the public consultation phase last fall, changes were recommended for 25 parish families, which impact 78 individual parishes and missions. These parishes and missions were invited to hold a second round of listening with their parishioners to gather input on the updated version of their parish family. This feedback has been incorporated into the discernment process.

Discernment is different than simply "making a decision." It involves prayer and quiet time to listen to the Holy Spirit to understand the direction this journey should take us. At this time, we ask everyone to continue praying for this effort.

We are 33 years old this month!

St. John the Baptist has a legacy of stewardship since its establishment in 1991. Members are encouraged to share God's gifts with others in a spirit of joy and generosity in a model established by Archbishop Hunthausen. Father Jack Walmsley was the founding pastor. Services were initially held at Horizon Elementary School until the 250-family parish raised the capital for the Church building. In 2001, the rapid growth of the parish included a new education building and office space.

In 2002, the parish welcomed Father Jim Coyne as pastor. In 2021 Father Jim officially retired; we welcomed Father Bill McKee as our new pastor.

There are over 80 ministries serving both parishioners and the wider community. Please see our website sittoc.org/go-ministries/ for the various ministries.
