Parish Priorities

In our parish priorities, we state, "St. John the Baptist Catholic Community offers Christ-like inclusion and acceptance."

To further this goal, the parish staff, for its own development, is reading Fr. James Martin's book, *Building a Bridge: How the Catholic Church and the LGBT Community Can Enter into a Relationship of Respect, Compassion, and Sensitivity.* Martin takes those last words from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, which teaches that Catholics are called to treat homosexuals with "respect, compassion, and sensitivity" (#2358).

One of the insights Martin gained was realizing that far more people than he had imagined are touched by this topic. Many Catholic families are affected by LGBT issues, be they moms and dads, brothers and sisters, grandparents uncles and aunts, cousins, or friends of gay Catholics.

Martin does not start with those issues that are divisive for the gay community: our Church's teaching on marriage and sexual relations. His approach is to focus on how we first can build a bridge in order for folks to be more receptive and understanding of our Church's teaching. The more foundational issue is our baptismal identity. We are all children of God, members of the Body of Christ.

What does it mean to offer Christ-like inclusion and acceptance? In part, it means being a place where all people will experience respect, compassion, and sensitivity. That challenges all of us.

Liturgy Commission Update

The Liturgy Commission met on Thursday, December 14. This commission will be focusing on one liturgical ministry at a time to evaluate and streamline processes as well as recruit more ministers. They will start with Eucharistic Ministers by creating a subcommittee to begin planning a retreat for our existing Eucharistic Ministers. The commission also discussed ways to recruit more ministers. About four times the number of current ministers are needed.

The Commission also chose two parish priorities to focus their efforts on:

- We delight in the rich diversity of cultures and traditions:
- We provide opportunities for all to grow and share in their faith as a life-long journey.

Discussion also included ways to focus on these goals, such as inviting parishioners from different cultures to a commission meeting to talk about their traditions.

The commission continued its discussion of the booklet, *Meeting Christ, Exploring the Liturgy*. There was discussion about when to sit after the *Prayers of the Faithful*. It was decided that Father Bill should sit immediately after the *Prayers of the Faithful* and have the congregation follow. Then the Lector will announce the names of who will bring up the gifts.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 11, 2024 at 7:00 pm.

Have you ever thought about how to serve as Jesus served in today's world? *St. Vincent de Paul* ministry provides the perfect opportunity to live out the call of the gospel to serve our neighbors in need.

For I was hungry and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. (Mt 25:35-36)

The St. Vincent de Paul Conference (SVdP) at St. John the Baptist is making a difference in our community by answering the calls of our neighbors for assistance with food, rent, and utility costs.

From January to December 2023, **thanks to your generous donations of \$92,797.00**, we were able to assist 1,549 people with rent and utilities as well as provide 132 bags of food and 73 bags of personal hygiene items. Through material donations, we helped 7 families with furniture and 4 families with clothing. In partnership with St. John the Baptist parish, SVdP also gave out 38 meals for Thanksgiving and served 41 families through the Giving Tree event.

Women's Commission Update

The St. John the Baptist Women's Commission met for the first time January 4. Starting with lectio and prayer over Luke's account of the Visitation, we moved to listening to one another as we expressed our hopes for the commission. Some ideas were that the commission would be a place for women's voices to be heard, for groups specifically for women to get started, and to advocate with national and international groups for the recognition of women as partners in the work of the gospel.

The commission would be charged with evaluating how we live out the parish priority to recognize the work of women and to ensure no lay ministry is specifically assigned to women or men.

One group expressed the hope that the commission is able to touch all women in the parish. We wrestled with how we might want to contribute to the work of the commission as individuals.

Our next meeting is Tuesday, February 6 at 6:30 pm, where we will address more concrete details.
