Praying the Stations of the Cross

Remember listening to a bedtime story as a child? Why not incorporate the Stations of the Cross as a bedtime story on Fridays during Lent, tailoring it to the age of the child? What better way to introduce children to the story of Jesus' Passion than to break it down into stages that children can reflect upon and remember? Keep in mind that the Stations are more than the re-telling of a story; it is a prayerful participation in the event that lies at the heart of Christianity.

At *St. John the Baptist*, ministries are called upon to lead the prayers and meditations at the stations every Friday during Lent. The third Stations of the Cross prayers and meditations during this Lent season was led by *Faith Formation* families as featured on the cover page. Three other ministries will have the opportunity to lead each Friday's prayer during this Lenten season.

The stations are always present in our church. Introduce your children to the Stations and take some time during this Lent season to attend at least one Stations of the Cross prayer and meditation as a family.

Father Bill is taking some time off to visit family in Florida. Let's hope he brings back some warm weather for us! In his absence, one of his past articles from January 22, 2023 is reprinted below. As we approach Easter and welcome returning Catholics or new Catholics, let us be reminded when we should make the sign of the cross during Mass.

When Do You Make the Sign of the Cross?



A couple of weeks ago, when I was teaching an RCIA Class on the Mass, the question emerged about when we make the Sign of the Cross. The Catholics in the group shared how they were trained to make the Sign of the Cross multiple times. It may surprise you when, or not, the rubrics call for the Sign of the Cross. Here is a little quiz. Answer **Yes** or **No** to the following if you should make the sign of the cross during these portions of the Mass. This quiz comes from Fr. Paul Turner's book, *In these or Similar Words*. The answers can be found below this article.

- 1. Anyone entering the church using holy water makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 2. The priest, putting incense in the thurible, makes the sign of the cross over the incense.
- 3. Anyone, making a genuflection, makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 4. All, at the beginning of Mass while saying "In the Name of the Father," makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 5. All, when the priest says, "May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins..." makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 6. When the priest sprinkles with water, all makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 7. Priest or deacon, before adding water to the wine, makes the sign of the cross over the water.
- 8. Priest, holding a particle of the host just before dropping it into the chalice, makes the sign of the cross over the chalice.
- 9. Any minister of communion holding the host and saying "The Body of Christ."
- 10. Anyone, after receiving Communion, makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 11. The priest, when saying the final blessing, makes the sign of the cross over the people.
- 12. The people, hearing the final blessing, makes the sign of the cross on themselves.
- 13. Anyone leaving the church using holy water makes the sign of the cross on themselves.

I must admit - when I took this quiz, I did not score 100%. I share this quiz with you just to acknowledge that we easily add things to the liturgy. It becomes a problem when individual gestures begin to weaken the expression of unity or draws attention to an individual.

This week we share, Contemplate "Earth Rise".

In 1968, astronaut William Anders spent his Christmas holiday circling the moon. On his fourth go-round, he took a photograph that is credited with helping to inspire the environmental movement, launched officially two years later, on Earth Day 1970. Apollo 8 entered the lunar orbit on Christmas Eve 1968, giving the astronauts a breathtaking view of Earth, blue-bright and beautiful, rising out of the vast lonely darkness of surrounding space. Filled with awe, Anders read aloud the Creation story from the book of Genesis. Subsequently, this photo has awakened thousands to the unique magnificence of our common home. On the 50th anniversary of the photo, Anders himself said, "We set out to explore the moon and instead discovered the Earth." Keep this image as your home screen or wallpaper on your phone.


