New Life in Christ A Call for All

By our Baptism we are called to follow the command that Jesus gave at the end of his earthly journey in human form. Jesus trusts that you and I will continue this ministry of the apostles, and we do so because we are disciples first. We are people who continue to learn and grow in faith. One way we do this is by tapping into the opportunities provided in our parish community. One such opportunity is the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) process, which is a formation process that leads adults into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Here at St. John the Baptist, a group of 20 individuals have been preparing to be fully initiated into our tradition. They have come into full communion with the Church at the Easter Vigil this weekend! In the midst of the RCIA process and as a community, we celebrate significant milestones with these Candidates and Catechumens.

Partners in the Gospel Update

For those of you who are just hearing this for the first time, Partners in The Gospel is the strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church. On July 1 of this year, Holy Spirit parish in Kent and St. John the Baptist parish in Covington will become one parish family under the leadership of one pastor and one or more parochial vicars (assistant priests). We are currently in Phase Zero, which is a time of preparation. Please continue to pray for this effort. Specifically, we pray that parishioners open their hearts to the Holy Spirit and that the Holy Spirit helps lead us on this journey.

Pastor and Parochial Vicar assignments will be announced at the Masses next weekend, April 6 & 7. All assignments will be listed on the Seattle Archdiocese website on Monday, April 8.

What is the Role of the Parish Liaison?

If you haven't heard the term, "Parish Liaison" as it relates to Partners in the Gospel, you will be hearing it a lot for the next few months.

Parish liaisons are professionals, who are hired and trained by the Archdiocese of Seattle. They will work in partnership with multiple parish families' pastors and their leadership teams to implement the parish family structure.

Each liaison will provide guidance, project management support, and ensure effective communication between the Partners in the Gospel core team, parish family (including pastor and staff), and the Planning and Mission Effectiveness team. The liaison will also support the parish in the creation of the One Parish Plan, which will be presented to the archbishop before becoming one canonical parish. Liaisons will start working with parishes starting this March.

Solemnity of Easter

Easter Sunday celebrates the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his victory over death. Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays.

The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the True Light of the world. The Paschal Candle used during the Easter Vigil is a central symbol of this Divine Light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.
