


Yard Sale Collection Dates

The yard sale will start with a preview sale on June 20, from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm (entry fee \$10), and then continue June 21 to 22 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, ending June 23 from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.

On the Cover

The fourth of the seven Sacraments celebrated in our Catholic faith is the *Sacrament of Confirmation*.
