Memorial Day

Memorial Day, an American holiday observed on the last Monday of May, honors men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Originally known as *Decoration Day*, it originated in the years following the Civil War. Many Americans observe *Memorial Day* by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings, or participating in parades.

For Christians, the custom of visiting the cemetery and praying for the dead can be traced to the women who returned to the tomb of Jesus that Easter morning to mourn and complete the preparation of His body for burial. Then and there, they discovered that He had been raised from the dead. Today, Catholic cemeteries are signs of hope that are places of prayer. They witness our faith in the Lord Jesus and the hope we share in his resurrection.

Today, our visits to the cemetery are prompted by our love and faith. We come to remember, to mourn, to give thanks for the life our beloved shared with us, and to strengthen our belief that one day we will be united with our beloved in Eternal Life.

Liturgy Commission Update

In their once-a-month meeting, the *Liturgy Commission* met on May 9 to discuss the following.

- The Eucharistic Minister retreat on Saturday, May 4, 2024, was a success! We had excellent attendance, including some who are new to the ministry. We received good feedback on the small group sharing and training of the refined process, and the food was much appreciated. The dress guidelines were handed out to the Eucharistic Ministers.
- The Commission will next address the Greeter Ministry role and recruitment. A subcommittee was formed for this effort.
- How do we introduce the dress guidelines to the other liturgical ministries? We will meet with the ministry leaders for their information and feedback on how to roll it out to their groups.
- We briefly discussed Partners in the Gospel as it pertains to the Liturgy.
- The Commission closed with a discussion of Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter on the Liturgy, Desiderio Desideravi, paragraphs 1 to 13.

The next meeting will be June 13 at 7:00 pm.

On the Cover

First Holy Communion is the third of the seven sacraments in our faith, following Baptism and Reconciliation. It is a ceremony where a baptized child receives the Eucharist for the first time. First Holy Communion celebrates the real presence of Christ in the bread, wine, and gathered community; it brings the child closer to Jesus. This ancient tradition is treasured as a sacred rite of passage that nourishes young souls on their spiritual journey.

Featured on the cover photo are the 33 young parishioners, who were welcomed to the table at a First Holy Communion Mass on May 11, 2024. Their names were mentioned in a previous bulletin.

We welcome them and pray that the Lord will continue to feed them through the Holy Eucharist for the rest of their lives!

Vacation Bible School Canceled

We regret to announce that this year's *Vacation Bible School* is canceled due to the lack of volunteers. We still have the energy around it, but we lack the people to help run the program. This is a great evangelistic tool for our children. Please pray for this ministry and the call for volunteers.

Change in Bulletin Printing

For the past few years, our bulletins have been printed by *LPi*. We are planning to terminate our contract with *LPI* and are currently negotiating a termination date. This means that our bulletin will be printed in-house as soon as we terminate.

In order to support this in-house printing, we need the help of sponsors, much like those who have sponsored our bulletin printing with *LPi*. The bulletin team will be contacting the sponsors on the back of our current bulletin to inquire about their contract obligations with *LPi* and how that sponsorship can possibly be transferred to St. John the Baptist.

Another way of sustaining our printing costs in-house is to have the support of our parishioners, not in the form of donations, but in the form of sponsorship. We will still accept businesses who want to sponsor our bulletin like they have with *LPi*. But in addition, we will also take one-time sponsorship like announcements (i.e., birth, birthdays, weddings, graduation, etc.), acknowledgements (i.e., thank you), and recognition. Note that we will not be publishing actual birthdates and phone numbers for security reasons.

We offer a token of our appreciation at each level in the form of short, medium, and large messages. Sponsorship pricing levels are still being determined.


