The Different Between Exposition and Adoration

On this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, I would like to focus on prayer in the presence of the Eucharist.

"Exposition" and "adoration" are terms that are often interchanged. However, there is a difference. Exposition gives the opportunity for the community to pray with the Eucharist visible. Adoration is most often praying before the tabernacle, when the Eucharist is present but not visible. Exposition is a liturgy of the Church, which involves communal prayer with periods of silence. Adoration is a private devotion that need not involve any communal prayer. Exposition is not a time just for your own quiet prayer; that is the purpose of Adoration.

The ritual book, *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass*, explains: "During the exposition, there should be prayers, songs, and readings to direct the attention of the faithful to the worship of Christ the Lord. To encourage a prayerful spirit, there should be readings from Scripture with a brief homily or exhortations to develop a better understanding of the Eucharistic mystery. It is also desirable for the people to respond to the word of God by singing and to spend some periods of time in religious silence" (95). The *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops* have created a variety of holy hours that focus our prayer to Jesus Christ on peace, life, vocations, and other topics that are at the heart of the life of the Church and the world.

The Rite of Eucharistic Exposition is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, which occurs in every Mass. It states, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." *Exposition* of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and our unity with the rest of the Church.

Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle is available during office hours (except when a Mass is being celebrated). You may need to enter through the parish office. *Exposition* is celebrated on the first Friday of each month, following the 9:00 am Mass.



Yard Sale Collection Dates

We will NOT accept the following: fuel tanks and cans, large appliances, car seats, helmets, and mattresses. Do not drop off any items without authorization. If unauthorized items are dropped off, we are responsible for disposing of them, which usually comes with a fee.

For those who want to get a jump start on the yard sale and would like to pay an entry fee of \$10 to shop before the yard sale is opened to the general public, join us on June 20 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Fees will be collected upon entry. The following two days will be open to the general public (no entry fees): June 21 to 22 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and June 23 from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.

What did the little tree say to the big tree? Leaf me alone! There wouldn't be little trees to say that line to the big trees if it weren't for our wonderful *Creation Care Team* planting Conifer seedlings! On March 2, 2024, a team of 24 adults and 19 youths (some featured on the front of our bulletin) planted 130 native conifer seedlings to shade out the English Ivy, Himalayan Blackberries, and other invasive species that have been encroaching the woods on the grounds of our parish.

These Conifers will sequester carbon from the air and produce oxygen. They will also provide homes for countless creatures.

So the next time you see a little tree on our grounds, "leaf" it alone but pray for its strength to become a big tree to provide oxygen and homes for creatures as well as keeping out the unwanted species of plants.

Change in Bulletin Printing

For the past few years, our bulletins have been printed by *LPi*. We are planning to terminate our contract with *LPI* and are currently negotiating a termination date. This means that our bulletin will be printed in-house as soon as we terminate.

In order to support this in-house printing, we need the help of sponsors, much like those who have sponsored our bulletin printing with *LPi*. The bulletin team will be contacting the sponsors on the back of our current bulletin to inquire about their contract obligations with *LPi* and how that sponsorship can possibly be transferred to St. John the Baptist.

Another way of sustaining our printing costs in-house is to have the support of our parishioners, not in the form of donations, but in the form of sponsorship. We will still accept businesses who want to sponsor our bulletin like they have with *LPi*. But in addition, we will also take one-time sponsorship like announcements (i.e., birth, birthdays, weddings, graduation, etc.), acknowledgements (i.e., thank you), and recognition. Note that we will not be publishing actual birthdates and phone numbers for security reasons.
