## Season of Creation Third Sunday Reflection



The five Sundays of the 2024 Season of Creation have themes that build up an integral ecological vision and spirituality that nurtures less violent, more life-giving relationships with each other and with the natural world. They speak powerfully to "hope and act" with creation.

The scriptures of the third Sunday warn that when we believe Jesus' claim to be the Son of God, that belief will have implications for our lives. When we act on the call that we hear to care for Earth, we will face resistance and conflict, as Isaiah and Jesus did. Today there are ecological martyrs who witness to this truth, as do our politics. We need your help again. The remaining ivy needs to be removed to prevent it from spreading, growing up trees, smothering ornamental plants, and preventing native plants from growing in the understory.

Join us on Saturday, September 28 from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon to cut & pull out the ivy. We recommend wearing long sleeve shirts, long pants, and garden gloves. Bring your pruning shears or a Pulaski (axe) if you have one. Community service credit is available for high school students.

In the past, we have supported people in this parish with water filtration systems, vented stoves, homes, and building a church that serves as a central meeting point for the parish. We also hope to sponsor a visit to SJTB by one of their young adult parish leaders.

#### Slow Down

#### **Backpack Buddies**



In partnership with Real Life Church's Storehouse food bank program, St. John the Baptist will be providing bags of food for approximately 35 kids to take home over the weekends to supplement their families' pantries when they are unable to get free meals at school. This is an opportunity for those who would like to give specific items at Sunday Masses, when you fill the food baskets during the offertory.

You can sign up for specific items and bring them on Saturday or Sunday when you come to Mass.

Items needed include oatmeal, Belvita biscuits, cans of chicken noodle soup, macaroni and cheese, Top Ramen, snack packs (popcorn, fruit cup, applesauce cup, and Mott fruit snacks), apples and/or oranges, milk, hot chocolate pack, and juice. **Starting September 27**, we will publish a list of the quantity of items needed for the food bags.

Volunteers will be needed on Sunday to separate the items and take them to a classroom. On Wednesdays, volunteers will meet, at a time to be announced, in the classroom to fill the bags. On Thursday morning, the bags will be delivered to Covington Elementary. We are looking for Sunday and Wednesday volunteers, especially families with youth (grade 5-8) or high school age kids.

No child should ever go hungry. We hope you will help us fill as many bags as we can! Thank you for your support.

#### **Sharing the Air That We Breathe**

Did you know that the average perfume has about 14 chemicals that could trigger an allergic reaction in fragrance-sensitive individuals?<sup>1</sup> These reactions can range from mild to severe/life-threatening.

For some of us, part of our wardrobe for the day is a spray of perfume, cologne, or aftershave. And for others, a whiff of perfume, cologne, or aftershave could mean a life or death situation. Please be considerate of the space we share in the sanctuary by using perfumes, etc. very sparingly. Better yet, avoid using them when attending Mass. Those of us with allergies thank you!

- To engage in that social critique which is above all a witness to the possibility of change.


The protection of creation is therefore not only an ethical issue, but one that is also eminently theological. It is the point where the mystery of man and the mystery of God intersect. 77
