

Visit the Altar de Dia de los Muertos

Remember your loved ones with a photo displayed at the *Day of the Dead* Altar or *Día de los Muertos, which* is a holiday celebrated throughout Mexico around the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2. It is a time of remembrance and praying for deceased loved ones. A key part of this celebration is the preparation of an Altar de *Día de Muertos* (*Day of the Dead* Altar), which is for family members to remember their beloved dead.

We will have an Altar de *Día de Muertos* in the narthex beginning Saturday, October 26, through *All Souls' Day* on November 2. We invite you to bring a photo of your deceased loved one to put on the Altar.

Ultimately, the *Day of the Dead* is a celebration of life! We remember deceased loved ones and tell stories of the lives they lived among us. And, together with the whole Church, we pray that they may enter into eternal life with Christ.

Please feel free to drop off a photo of your loved one at the Altar de *Dia de los Muertos* out in the narthex. Don't forget to pick up your photo after November 25. May our beloved, who have all gone before us, rest in peace.
