

Visit the Altar de Dia de los Muertos

Remember your loved ones with a photo displayed at the *Day of the Dead* Altar or Altar de *Día de los Muertos. Day of the Dead* is a holiday celebrated throughout Mexico around the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2. It is a time of remembrance and praying for deceased loved ones. A key part of this celebration is the preparation of an Altar de *Día de los Muertos* (*Day of the Dead* Altar), which is for family members to remember their beloved dead.

An Altar de *Día de los Muertos* is displayed in the narthex through *All Souls' Day*, November 2. We invite you to bring a photo of your deceased loved one to put on the altar.

Ultimately, the *Day of the Dead* is a celebration of life! We remember deceased loved ones and tell stories of the lives they have lived among us. And, together with the whole Church, we pray that they may enter into eternal life with Christ.

Please feel free to drop off a photo of your loved one at the Altar de *Dia de los Muertos* out in the narthex. Don't forget to pick up your photo after November 2. May our beloved, who have all gone before us, rest in peace.

Back to Standard Time



If you show up at church on November 3 to an empty sanctuary, it's because you forgot to **turn your clock back an hour the night before**. Now you have to wait an hour for Mass to start!

Most clocks today are atomic clocks, so they will automatically adjust for switching back to Standard Time. But if you have a wind-up clock, you do the switching back. Don't be caught coming to church early; get that extra hour of sleep!
