

Update on **Backpack Buddies Program**

Thank you to everyone who donated food to the Backpack Buddies program! We continue to fill 35 bags every week for Covington Elementary kids to take home in their backpacks to supplement their families' pantries, when they are unable to get free meals at school.



Because of our limited storage, we can only take items on a weekly basis. Please keep that in mind when you sign up for Backpack Buddies Covington Elementary. If you are unable to provide all 35 pieces of an item (one each per backpack unless otherwise noted), please mention that in your comments.

No child should ever go hungry! We hope you will help us fill as many bags as we can! Thank you for your support.

Do You Know Where They Are?

AEDs - what are they and what do they do? It stands for Automated External Defibrillators, and they are used in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to analyze the heart rhythm and, if needed, to deliver an electric shock to re-establish an effective heart rhythm. Once it is turned on, the AED gives instructions on how to use it. It is important to have it available to use whenever CPR is administered, so a trained medical person can understand what rhythm the victim's heart is in, should it need to be shocked.

So what does this have to do with you? If someone needs CPR anywhere on the St. John the Baptist grounds, you as a bystander, need to call 911 and also get the closest AED and bring it to the site. It is better to know where these are located before they are needed, so you don't have to find them in an emergency!

Locate the AEDs on the grounds. There is one in the narthex hallway towards the office by the Lost and Found area and the fire extinguisher. There is also one in the McMullen Center, in the dining area near the kitchen. Be familiar with the AED signs, so you can easily spot them.



Heart attacks are most likely to occur during the winter months, especially during the holidays, according to The George Washington University Hospital. Winter is coming - let's not wait until you need an AED to start looking for an AED!
