Update From the Liturgy Commission

The commission met for their monthly meeting on October 10. The subcommittee working on updating the *Hospitality* (formerly *Greeter*) *Ministry* gave an update on the ministry instructions. This ministry held a retreat on October 19 for current and interested future ministers.

Also discussed were considerations for a request from a parishioner to replace the procession crucifix, which has been a part of our parish since the beginning. The commission will continue to discuss this request at their next meeting on November 14.

Ongoing education is a regular part of their work, so the commission members began a discussion of the document from the *Archdiocese of Seattle* entitled, "Partners in the Gospel Liturgical Considerations." They will conclude the discussion of this document at the next meeting.


Thank You to Our "Street Cleaners"
