



Olive Wood Carvings for Sale



The handicrafts trade in the Holy Land has evolved as a cultural tradition of the Holy Land people over many centuries and has become an industry of significance to the local economy.

Issa Jaraysa will be at St. John the Baptist on the weekend of February 1 and 2, 2025 to sell these handicrafts after

all the Masses. They are crafted from olive wood. Artisans use only the pruned and discarded pieces of young olive trees and sprouts from the old, unproductive trees.

The proceeds support Catholic families in the Holy Land. The sale of these handicrafts is their major source of income. The wares (nativities, crucifixes, rosaries, statues, and more) are from more than 75 families in Bethlehem. They are beautiful and unique items.

Help Keep Our Kitchen Clean

Our facilities calendar at St. John the Baptist is full of exciting celebrations throughout 2025. Many of them will be held at the McMullen Center, and the kitchen will be used for food prep.

A "sweep" of the kitchen at the end of 2024 revealed things that hosts and hostesses need to be especially aware of.

- Pots, dishes, and utensils were not clean and put in their proper places.
- Cooking areas (sinks, counters, stove, oven, grill) as well as the refrigerators/freezer were not cleaned.
- Floors were not swept and mopped.
- Dirty towels were not washed and dried in the washer/ dryer or placed in a bucket of bleach water located near the sinks. Damp cloths are a harbor for bacteria, and many were found damp but no water in the buckets.
- Unused food and leftovers were not removed from refrigerator or freezer after completion of event.
- Garbage was not taken out.
- Power to the dishwasher and gas line to the stove were not turned off.
- Building was not secured after leaving.

For all ministries, parishioners, and anyone who uses the kitchen, there is a kitchen checklist that includes the group's name and a responsible person who is in charge of managing the kitchen. All users are required to complete and return the checklist to the Kitchen Checklist folder on the kitchen table. Completing the checklist will assist in identifying who to contact if discrepancies are noted during weekly inspections. Following this process will ensure that the kitchen is clean and ready for the next event. Any special kitchen requests should be coordinated with *David Aldous*, our Facilities Steward.


Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week
