#### ICE Agents and Searches

The Archdiocese has released guidance to all parishes about the potential for *Immigration and Customs* Enforcement (ICE) agents to conduct searches on church property. The first thing to keep in mind is that such searches are extremely rare. The second is that while we are not permitted to serve as 24-hour "sanctuary," *ICE* agents may not conduct searches of church property without a signed judicial warrant. This is similar to how we interact with the police. The Archdiocese has instructed that **no one besides the** pastor or his authorized designee may engage with *ICE*. Our goal is to maintain a safe environment for all to come and encounter the love of Jesus, no matter their status. We are praying for all of our immigrant brothers and sisters, that they may live in peace and be treated with dignity. # Cold Temperatures Bring Icy Mornings

Ice can be fun if it's on a skating rink. But it's not so much fun if you have to walk on it, like on our church's parking lot and on the sidewalks. In fact, it's very dangerous!

When the temperatures drop below freezing like we've had in the last few weeks, frost and ice form on the parking lot and sidewalks. It creates unsafe conditions for people attending the early morning Masses.

Without a dedicated ministry, de-icing the parking lot is only made possible by snagging a parishioner or two before Mass to help with the de-icing. We need a few strong people/families willing to be on a winter rotation to come and spread the de-icer on our sidewalks and parking lot at 8:00 am on these icy mornings. This will be a special ministry team that will only operate through mid-March.

#### What To Do With Old Palms

We will soon enter the season of Lent, which has 45 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

Remember to **bring your old palms for burning**. Place them in the bin in the narthex. They will be burned at the Lent Event on March 2, 2025 and used as ash for distribution on Ash Wednesday.



Did you know that the proper way to dispose of palms is to either burn them and spread the ashes outside or bury them? They must never be discarded in the trash.


