ICE Agents and Searches

In last week's bulletin, there was a guidance released by the Archdiocese to all parishes about the potential for *Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)* agents conducting searches on church property. It can't be stressed enough that such **searches are extremely rare**. What's important to note is that **no one should engage with** *ICE* regardless of the circumstances. The only person who should be talking to *ICE* agents is Father Carlos. If you are approached by someone from *ICE* at any time while on the church grounds, please refer them to a staff member, and do not engage with them.

Our goal is to maintain a safe environment for all to come and encounter the love of Jesus, no matter their status. We are praying for all of our immigrant brothers and sisters, that they may live in peace and be treated with dignity. What To Do With Old Palms

We will soon enter the season of Lent, which has 45 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

Remember to bring your old palms for burning. Place them in the bin in the narthex. They will be burned at the Lent Event on March 2, 2025 and used as ash for distribution on Ash Wednesday.

Did you know that the proper way to dispose of palms is to either burn them and spread the ashes outside or bury them? They must never be discarded in the trash.



2025... A YEAR OF HOPE? YES!



We are now almost two months into the new year. Depending on where you are at politically, you have been edified or (and) challenged by the new administration. Depending on where you are in your ecclesiology (i.e. you view and relationship of the Church including her leadership - local and universal), you have been edified or/and challenged by the state of the Church in the world. Regardless of where your informed positions and sentiments may be, we do not let that take away what belongs to us as Christians, HOPE.

This is the theme chosen for this Jubilee year. Remember that Christian hope is not a mere "positive attitude," it is the trust and knowledge that *that which we hoped for, Christ, has come* and continues to be present in the Church, walking with us. To be a Christian then is to walk in hope always, to walk with Christ. From this conviction comes the theme of the Jubilee, Pilgrims of Hope.

Lets live in hope as we continue our pilgrimage together. In the Archdiocese, we have reasons for hope as we celebrate 175 years of the presence of Christ through the Church in Western Washington which providentially falls under the same time as the Jubilee year. To celebrate and participate in the indulgence that comes from a Jubilee year, the Archdiocese is inviting all the faithful to do the following spiritual exercises:

- 1. Make a confession
- 2. Receive the Eucharist
- 3. Visit one of the following sites: St. Joachim Mission in Lummi, St. Peter Mission in Suquamish, St. James Cathedral in Seattle, or the new Vietnamese Martyrs church in Tukwila.
- 4. Do a holy hour in Eucharistic adoration and conclude with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any of its forms, and end with an invocation to Mary.

You can do this individually or put a group together. If anyone is interested in organizing a group for Parish Family 30, let me know and we can come up with a game plan!

There is also much hope as we enter the next phase of Partners in the Gospel. I am currently finalizing the list of key parishioner volunteers to invite to be part of the Parish Family Advisory Council, so please keep that endeavor in your prayers. Once that team is defined, they will be trained to begin the next phase which is parishioner input.

2025... ¿UN AÑO DE ESPERANZA? ¡SÍ!

Ya estamos a casi dos meses de haber comenzado el nuevo año. Dependiendo de su posición política, la nueva administración lo ha edificado o lo ha desafiado. Dependiendo de su posición eclesiológica (es decir, su visión y relación con la Iglesia, incluido su liderazgo, local y universal), el estado de la Iglesia en el mundo lo ha edificado o lo ha desafiado. Independientemente de cuáles sean sus posiciones y sentimientos informados, no permitamos que eso nos quite lo que nos pertenece como cristianos: la ESPERANZA.

Éste es el tema elegido para este año jubilar. Recordemos que la esperanza cristiana no es una mera "actitud positiva", es la confianza y el conocimiento de que *lo que esperábamos, Cristo, ha venido y sigue estando presente en la Iglesia, caminando con nosotros*. Ser cristiano es, pues, caminar siempre en la esperanza, caminar con Cristo. De esta convicción nace el tema del Jubileo: Peregrinos de la esperanza.

Vivamos con esperanza mientras continuamos nuestra peregrinación juntos. En la Arquidiócesis, tenemos motivos para la esperanza al celebrar 175 años de la presencia de Cristo a través de la Iglesia en el oeste de Washington, que providencialmente coincide con el año jubilar. Para celebrar y participar en la indulgencia que proviene de un año jubilar, la Arquidiócesis invita a todos los fieles a realizar los siguientes ejercicios espirituales:

- 1. Haz una confesión
- 2. Recibir la Eucaristía
