BEFORE YOU SAY ALLELUIA, REMEMBER: YOU ARE DUST!

Dear parish family,

Welcome to March of the year 2025! In just a few days we will be entering the holy season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we will be marked with ashes and told to remember that we are going to die. Then, after 40 days being forced to reflect on our impeding death, we will then be led to Holy Week and Easter Sunday, the most important days for us Christians, where we will affirm the truth of the gospel: the reality that **CHRIST IS RISEN** from the dead, and you and I have been saved from sin and death! **Alleluia**!

This statement of faith is what we call, "**the reason for our hope**" (1 Peter), and it is what Pope Francis is inviting us, as a universal Church, to reflect and pray about together during this Lenten season, which will carry us forward the whole year. When the Body of Christ prays together in unity for a specific grace, things happen, the Holy Spirit is manifested, so it is crucial that we do so.

I therefore invite you, as we enter into this season of lent, to pray together for the grace of renewed hope in the gift of the resurrection. This will be essential for the growth of our spiritual lives and the unity of our community.

To make it happen, Holy Mother Church is asking us to do three spiritual exercises during lent:

- 1. **Enter into the process of conversion.** Where am I right now in my spiritual and moral life? Am I walking, standing still, or walking back? Am I hesitant to go where I know the Lord needs me to go? Am I being honest in my resolve to sin no more? What is degrading my dignity?
- 2. **Be willing to walk with others, regardless of who the other is**. Who do you tend to ignore? Who makes you uncomfortable? Who do you tend to reject?
- 3. Pray that everyone may be open to the promise of Christian hope. Am I convinced that I need salvation? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? What difference does this make in my life? Is the way I live my life evident that I believe this? If not, what needs to change?

The Christian faith declares that Christ is risen from the dead, and we have been saved from sin and death! This is the reason for our hope. Our hope lies in the faith (trust and knowledge) that God wills and grants eternal life to all his children. Alleluia!

For those of us who grew up Catholic hearing this statement time and time again, it can be easy to forget the importance and implications of what it actually means, so this Lenten season, let's reclaim the power in the faith that gives us hope!







ANTES DE DECIR ALELUYA, RECUERDA: ¡ERES POLVO!

Querida familia,

¡Bienvenidos a marzo del año 2025! En pocos días entraremos en el tiempo sagrado de la **Cuaresma**. El **Miércoles de Ceniza** seremos marcados con cenizas y se nos dirá que **recordemos que vamos a morir**. Luego, después de 40 días de ser obligados a reflexionar sobre nuestra inminente muerte, seremos conducidos a la Semana Santa y al Domingo de Pascua, el día más importante para nosotros los cristianos, donde afirmaremos la verdad del evangelio: la realidad de que **CRISTO HA RESUCITADO** de entre los muertos, y tú y yo hemos sido **salvados** del pecado y de la muerte. ¡**Aleluya**!

Esta declaración de fe es lo que llamamos "la razón de nuestra esperanza" (1 Pedro), y es lo que el Papa Francisco nos invita, como Iglesia universal, a reflexionar y orar juntos durante este tiempo de Cuaresma que nos llevará adelante durante todo el año. Cuando el Cuerpo de Cristo ora junto en unidad por una gracia específica, suceden cosas: el Espíritu Santo se manifiesta. Por eso, es crucial que lo hagamos.

Por eso, al iniciar este tiempo de Cuaresma, **los invito a orar juntos para pedir la gracia de una esperanza renovada en el don de la resurrección**. Esto será esencial para el crecimiento de nuestra vida espiritual y la unidad de nuestra comunidad.

Para que esto suceda, la Santa Madre Iglesia nos pide que hagamos **tres ejercicios espirituales** durante la Cuaresma:

- 1. Entrar en el proceso de conversión. ¿Dónde estoy ahora mismo en mi vida espiritual y moral? ¿Estoy caminando, parado o caminando de regreso? ¿Dudo en ir a donde sé que el Señor necesita que vaya? ¿Estoy siendo honesto en mi resolución de no pecar más? ¿Qué está degradando mi dignidad?
- 2. Estar dispuesto a caminar con otros, sin importar quién sea el otro. ¿A quién tiendes a ignorar? ¿Quién te hace sentir incómodo? ¿A quién tiendes a rechazar?
- 3. Oremos para que todos estén abiertos a la promesa de la esperanza cristiana. ¿Estoy convencido de que necesito la salvación? ¿O actúo como si pudiera salvarme por mí mismo? ¿Anhelo la salvación e invoco la ayuda de Dios para alcanzarla? ¿Qué diferencia hace esto en mi vida? ¿La forma en que vivo mi vida es evidente que creo esto? Si no, ¿qué necesita cambiar?

La fe cristiana declara que Cristo resucitó de entre los muertos y que hemos sido salvados del pecado y de la muerte. Ésta es la razón de nuestra esperanza. Nuestra esperanza está en la fe (confianza y conocimiento) de que Dios quiere y concede la vida eterna a todos sus hijos. ¡Aleluya!

Para aquellos de nosotros que crecimos como católicos escuchando esta declaración una y otra vez, puede ser fácil olvidar la importancia y las implicaciones de lo que realmente significa, así que en esta temporada de Cuaresma, ¡recuperemos el poder de la fe que nos da esperanza!




