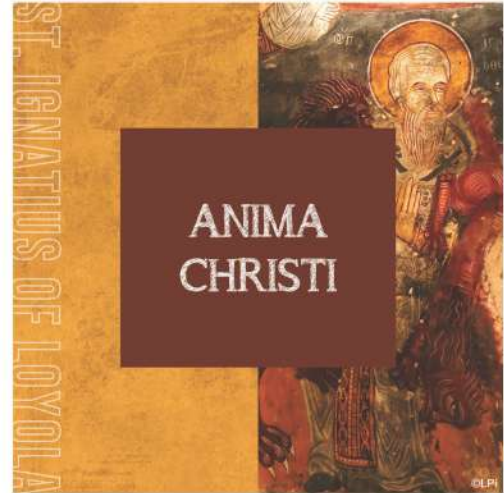

Fr. Carlos Responds to Concerns About Language in the Nicene Creed, Affirming Our Unity in Christ

To The Members of the St. John the Baptist Parish Community:

On February 13, the Women's Commission held their monthly meeting. Fr. Carlos attended and addressed a question he received regarding the use of the word "men" in reciting the Nicene Creed ("...for us men and our salvation...") during Mass. He acknowledged the concern that such language makes some women and girls feel excluded or "less than." After consulting with Bishop Schuster and Jennifer Day, the Archdiocese's liturgist, Fr. Carlos shared that the response was that no person, lay or priest, "may add, remove, or change anything in the liturgy" on his/her own authority (as quoted from *SACRAM LITURGIAM* by Pope Paul VI).

Fr. Carlos emphasized, "part of my responsibility as pastor is to assist the archbishop in helping maintain communities that are united with the universal Church." He underscored that the Church serves as the sacrament of unity between God and humanity, stating, "and I was ordained for that mission – to remain in Christ." He pointed out that the sacraments and the continuity of the Mass are principal signs of that unity. While some flexibility exists in certain areas, clear guidelines dictate what must remain consistent across the Church. He mentioned referring to the congregation as "brothers and sisters" or "family" as example variants.

Fr. Carlos expressed his understanding of language limitations and referenced St. Paul: "all who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ...there is neither Jew or Greek, slave or free person, male or female... for all are one in Christ Jesus (Gal 3:28)." When the commission inquired about the possibility of individuals and families omitting the word "men" while reciting the creed, he indicated that if the use of the word is a barrier to the individual expression of that faith, they could omit it personally. He assured them, "Know that I am sensitive to your concern and will continue to exercise my ministry and preaching in a way that upholds every single one of us under the same dignity in which we were made."
