No Unauthorized Items in the Narthex



Remember Your Deceased Loved Ones with Flowers


Spring flowers adorn the sanctuary and narthex on Easter day. But did you know that flowers are specifically banned as decorations around the altar for nearly all of Lent? It is because Lent is a solemn season of preparation for the Easter Triduum.

At the arrival of Easter, the altar and surrounding areas are decorated with flowers to symbolize the new life that emerges from Jesus's death on Good Friday.

This year, and every year, we request donations to purchase flowers for Easter. In addition to the donations, we ask that donors write the names of their deceased loved ones on a card. Those cards become part of the Easter décor and are displayed on ribbons in the narthex. This is a beautiful way, during Easter, to remember those family and friends who have gone before us. Please donate funds for a pot or two of flowers by April 13, Palm Sunday. You can find envelopes and cards in the narthex.


