



Pope Francis 1936 - 2025

Pope Francis was born **Jorge Mario Bergoglio** on December 17, 1936 in Flores, a neighborhood of Buenos Aires. He was the oldest of the five children of **Mario José Bergoglio** and **Regina María Sívori**. Mario Bergoglio was an Italian immigrant and an accountant from Piedmont.

Pope Francis earned a chemical technician's diploma from his high school and entered the Jesuit novitiate in March 1958. As part of his Jesuit formation, he taught literature and psychology at Jesuit high schools in the mid-1960s, and he was ordained to the priesthood on December 13, 1969.

In 1973, he was appointed superior of the Jesuit province of Argentina. In 1992, *Pope John Paul II* named him an auxiliary bishop of Buenos Aires. He was promoted to coadjutor archbishop in 1997 and became head of the archdiocese in 1998. *St. John Paul* named him to the College of Cardinals three years later.

On March 13, 2013, at the age of 76, he was elected to succeed **Pope Benedict XVI** and took the name of **Francis** to emulate **St. Francis**'s dedication to poverty, peace, and the environment and was known for his humility and his love for the poor.

Pope Francis was the head of the Catholic Church and sovereign of the Vatican City State from 2013 until his death on April 21, 2025.

Annual Catholic Appeal Kickoff

This year, **our parish's goal is \$136,467.00**. Last year, the average gift from our parish was \$466.00; across the archdiocese, it was \$545.00. All gifts received over our goal will be returned to the parish for our parish project, which is supporting **Catholic Relief Services** and the Archdiocese **Mission Essential Parish Family Fund**. Catholic Relief Services has experienced a decrease in funding, impacting its ability to provide vital humanitarian assistance. The Mission Essential Parish Family Fund supports parish families within our archdiocese in economically-depressed regions or rural areas with small populations. This support allows the parish to carry out the mission of the Church.

There are 25 families, who pledged recurring gifts last year (2024) into this year (2025). Thank you for continuing to support *ACA*.




