

We Have A Pope!

We joyfully welcome **Pope Leo XIV**, born Robert Francis Prevost, as the 267th Bishop of Rome. His life reflects a profound commitment to faith, mission, and pastoral service shaped by rich cultural experiences.

Born in Chicago in 1955 to a family of French, Italian, and Spanish heritage, Pope Leo XIV grew up in a vibrant multicultural environment. He earned a degree in mathematics from Villanova University in 1977 and soon entered the Order of Saint Augustine. He professed his solemn vows in 1981 and was ordained a priest in 1982 after completing his Master of Divinity. He later earned a doctorate in canon law in Rome.

In 1985, he was sent as a missionary to Peru, serving the people of Chulucanas and Trujillo. There, he acted as seminary rector, canon law professor, and parish priest—deeply immersing himself in the lives of the local faithful.

Returning to the U.S., he became Provincial of the Chicago Augustinians and later served two terms as Prior General of the worldwide Order of Saint Augustine. In 2014, he was called back to Peru as Apostolic Administrator of Chiclayo, becoming its bishop the following year.

In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and elevated him to cardinal later that year.

Now, as Pope Leo XIV, he brings a wealth of pastoral, missionary, and administrative experience. We give thanks for his 'yes' and pray for a papacy guided by wisdom, compassion, and the Holy Spirit.



From our archbishop: Pope Leo XIV is an amazing choice as the next successor of Peter. The name chosen tells us he will put the social teachings of the Church at the heart of this pontificate. I have found this man in my brief encounters to be humble, affable, confident and competent in carrying out his responsibilities. We have hopeful and bright days ahead!

Partners in the Gospel - We Begin!

We are entering a new phase as a parish family. I'm happy to announce we have our two teams that will help guide our journey:

- Parish Family Leadership Team (PFLT): Key staff members from both parishes.
- Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC): Parishioners representing both communities.

These teams will begin organizing listening sessions and surveys to hear from you. We'll follow the synodal model—listening to the Holy Spirit by listening to one another. Guided by the archdiocese, and with my own pastoral input, we will discern how to become more effective missionary disciples of Jesus.

Timeline Overview:

- Organization & Kickoff: through March 2025
- Who Are We?: June 2025
- Who Do We Want to Become?: December 2025

- What Will We Be Called?: April-June 2027
- Final Report & Review: through 2027

SB5375 - Seal of Confession at Risk

The Washington State Legislature recently passed SB5375, requiring clergy to report abuse without exception—even if learned during the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is a direct violation of the sacred seal of confession.

Archbishop Etienne has instructed all priests to maintain the seal, affirming that "we must obey God rather than man" (Acts 5:29). The Archdiocese remains fully committed to reporting abuse and protecting the vulnerable. However, our longstanding policies rightly exempt information heard in confession, where confidentiality is absolute.

The Archbishop continues to engage in dialogue with state leaders on this critical issue. Let us trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us through all challenges, as we walk together in faith and love.

SB5375 – El secreto de confesión está en riesgo

La Legislatura del Estado de Washington aprobó recientemente la ley SB5375, que exige al clero denunciar los abusos sin excepción, incluso si se conocen durante el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Esto constituye una violación directa del secreto de confesión.

El arzobispo Etienne ha instruido a todos los sacerdotes a mantener el secreto, afirmando que «debemos obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres» (Hechos 5:29). La Arquidiócesis mantiene su firme compromiso de denunciar el abuso y proteger a las personas vulnerables. Sin embargo, nuestras políticas de larga data eximen con razón la información obtenida en confesión, donde la confidencialidad es absoluta.

El Arzobispo continúa dialogando con los líderes estatales sobre este tema crítico. Confiemos en que el Espíritu Santo nos guiará a través de todos los desafíos, mientras caminamos juntos en la fe y el amor.
