## One Church, Many Gifts Update from Annual Catholic Appeal

Thank you to all who have responded to the needs of our regional Church by supporting this campaign. As of July 3, **\$116,661.28 (85% of our goal)** has been pledged towards our parish goal of \$136,467.00 with **23% of parish households participating**.

Last year during the same time period, we had just over \$17,000.00 more than we do now. Last year's rebate was about \$31,000 and allowed us to complete an important safety project - build a fence around our retention ponds. This year, we need another \$20,000 to bring us over the top and get a rebate for next year's project (to be determined).

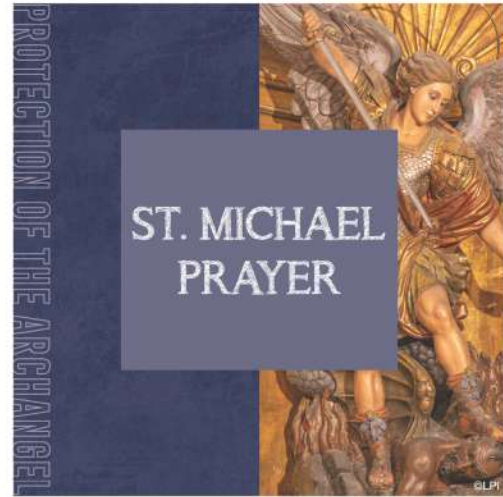

## HAPPY ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY!

This July 1st marked our first year of walking together as Partners in the Gospel. To commemorate we did a Eucharistic Pilgrimage like we did to kick off our partnership last year, this time from Holy Spirit to Vietnamese Martyrs. **“Why are you terrified, O you of little faith?” (Matthew 8:26)**

These words of Jesus come to us today as we enter the next chapter of our two parishes, continuing our journey to become one parish family in Christ for the greater good of Kent-Covington. One year ago, we began this partnership hearing Jesus' invitation: “Follow me wherever I go.” We're committing ourselves to this journey, not knowing what would come.

Over this past year, we have gotten to know each other more deeply through shared missions, ministries, and events, building bridges of trust along the way. We now have our consultative teams who will lead the Partners process. We have begun to see more people come to Mass and are slowly engaging more of our young people.

Now, as we celebrate our one-year anniversary on this jubilee pilgrimage of hope, under the intercession of St. Junipero Serra, we enter the very heart of our mission together. St. Junipero Serra gave his life entirely to God's mission. At 56 – when many seek comfort – he left everything in Spain to travel to Mexico and then to California. He walked thousands of miles establishing missions along the coast, bringing Jesus to people who had never heard His name. His motto was *Siempre adelante!* – Always forward!

We know his missionary activity was complex, marked by human errors and injustices that affected native peoples deeply. Yet, as the Church teaches in *Evangelii Nuntiandi* and *Redemptoris Missio*, God still works His saving plan. The mission of the Church is to proclaim Christ with respect for cultures, offering the saving love of Jesus with humility and joy.

The Gospel today reminds us that Jesus is in the boat with us. As we begin the next phase of Partners in the Gospel, it may feel like the winds are strong and the waves high. Change can be daunting, but Jesus says: “Why are you terrified, O you of little faith?”

Let us move forward together. *Siempre adelante. Always forward.* There is much to come, and remember that you are an important part of every step of this journey. May Jesus lead us to new life, new hope, and a mission that will bear fruit for generations to come.

Este 1 de julio cumplimos nuestro primer año de caminar juntos como Compañeros en el Evangelio. **“¿Por qué os alarmáis, hombres de poca fe?” (Mateo 8:26)**

Estas palabras de Jesús nos llegan hoy al iniciar el siguiente capítulo de nuestras dos parroquias, continuando nuestro camino para convertirnos en una sola familia parroquial en Cristo por el bien común de Kent-Covington. Hace un año, iniciamos esta colaboración escuchando la invitación de Jesús: «Sígueme adondequiera que vaya». Nos comprometimos en este camino, sin saber qué nos depararía.

Durante este último año, nos hemos conocido más profundamente a través de misiones, ministerios y eventos compartidos, construyendo lazos de confianza. Ahora contamos con nuestros equipos consultivos que liderarán el proceso de Socios, hemos empezado a ver más gente asistiendo a misa y, poco a poco, estamos involucrando a más jóvenes.

Ahora, al celebrar nuestro primer aniversario en esta peregrinación jubilar de esperanza, bajo la intercesión de San Junípero Serra, nos adentramos juntos en el corazón mismo de nuestra misión. San Junípero Serra entregó su vida por completo a la misión de Dios. A los 56 años, cuando muchos buscan consuelo, lo dejó todo en España para viajar a México y luego a California. Caminó miles de kilómetros estableciendo misiones a lo largo de la costa, llevando a Jesús a personas que nunca habían oído su nombre. Su lema era ¡Siempre adelante!

Sabemos que su actividad misionera fue compleja, marcada por errores humanos e injusticias que afectaron profundamente a los pueblos originarios. Sin embargo, como enseña la Iglesia en *Evangelii Nuntiandi* y *Redemptoris Missio*, Dios sigue obrando su plan de salvación. La misión de la Iglesia es proclamar a Cristo con respeto a las culturas, ofreciendo el amor salvador de Jesús con humildad y alegría.

El Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que Jesús está en la barca con nosotros. Al comenzar la siguiente fase de Compañeros en el Evangelio, puede que sintamos vientos fuertes y olas altas. El cambio puede ser abrumador, pero Jesús dice: "¿Por qué se asustan, hombres de poca fe?"

Avancemos juntos. Siempre adelante. Siempre adelante. Hay mucho por venir, y recuerda que eres parte importante de cada paso de este camino. Que Jesús nos guíe hacia una nueva vida, una nueva esperanza y una misión que dé fruto para las generaciones venideras.
