

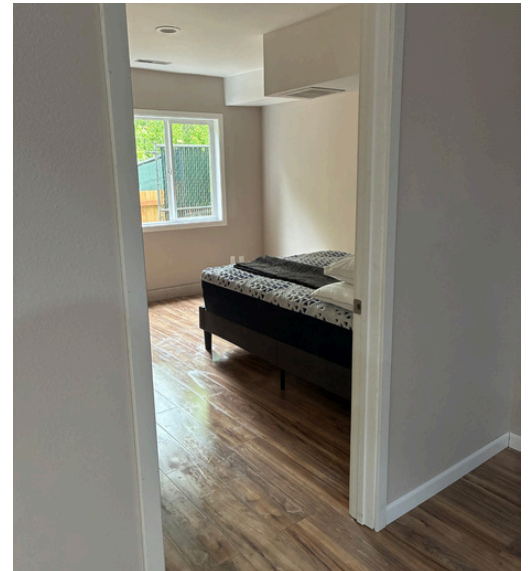

The basement of our recently purchased rectory has been fully transformed into a self-contained apartment, complete with a bedroom and kitchen. It is now ready to welcome seminarians, men in discernment, and visiting priests. Led by **David Aldous** from St. John the Baptist and **Miguel Murillo** from Holy Spirit, the team installed updated plumbing and electrical wiring. They also added partition walls and a door, and finished the space with cabinetry, appliances, and window blinds.

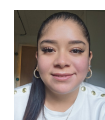

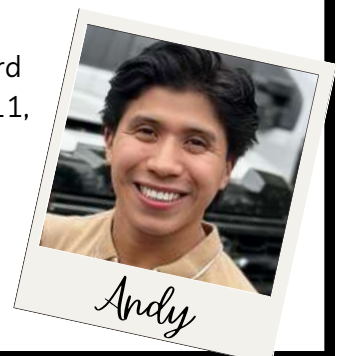
Pedro
