Seal of Confession Preserved

You might have already heard that a federal court blocked a new Washington state law that would have forced Catholic priests to face jail time unless they break the sacred seal of confession. This law would have required clergy to report abuse shared within the sacred confines of the confessional.

After a July 14 hearing, a US district judge issued a preliminary injunction, temporarily halting the enforcement of the law. The judge further argued that this law is likely unconstitutional, because it arguably violates the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment and places clergy in the position of choosing between their religious beliefs and potential criminal penalties. If this law - Senate Bill 5375 - was enforced, it threatened to impose penalties of up to 364 days in jail, a \$5,000 fine, and potential civil liability on priests who uphold the seal of confession and obey God's command.

The Catholic Church in Washington state has spent years strengthening its approach to protecting minors and vulnerable adults through its *Safe Environment* programs, background checks, and reporting policies. Across the Archdiocese of Seattle, all Church personnel are already required to report suspected abuse to law enforcement or child protection agencies. These policies cover archdiocesan parishes, schools, and other ministries. The Church supports mandatory reporting except in the narrow instance of the sacrament of confession.

What's next? The injunction temporarily blocks the law's enforcement related to confession while the legal case proceeds to a full trial where the constitutionality of the law will be further examined.

All supplies are accepted, but the **most needed** are:



August is here! And with it, we begin to sense the end of the summer season. At the parish office, that means gearing up for a new year of sacramental preparation and formation.

As you know, *Partners in the Gospel* is a three-year process of discernment to identify how we can work together and set a shared vision for the future. Most changes in staff, ministry, and liturgy will take place gradually, following prayerful consultation. However, some changes will happen more organically and faster as circumstances arise. With that said, I want to share an **exciting** development in our **youth ministry**.

After two years on staff, **Peter Guthrie** will be moving on to the next chapter in his vocational journey. He has been accepted to begin formation with the **Jesuits**! Her priority this year will be to get to know the St. John community, build relationships with families and volunteers, recruit additional youth ministry leaders, and work toward a new vision for the future of youth ministry. Please keep Veronica in your prayers as she begins this important new role. Let us give her a warm welcome to the Parish Family 30 team!



MEN'S 5V5 SOCCER

Interested in Recreational 5-a-side Soccer?

Scan the code below to join our Kent, WA group



We're bringing together a small group of players who can commit to regular practice games and are willing to stick to a 5v5/6v6/4v4 format that avoids overcrowding and ensures a quality experience for all. Participation is free (no fees) and games are mutually planned. While geared toward men over 30, all ages and skill levels are welcome so long as you play clean and respect your teammates. Once we have the required numbers, new additions will be restricted to ensure existing members get enough game time.



HOW WE PLAY: The intent is to organize regular games with an inclusive style of play where everyone has an opportunity to participate. That means greater emphasis on "team" aspects of the sport such as passing – and avoiding solo ball hogging dribbles and potentially dangerous contact. Ideally, no more than 5 touches or keeping the ball for longer than 5 seconds. We play without a goalkeeper and all 5 on-field players take turns rotating positions as part of a fluid formation that encourages movement and shared possession in a quick passing "tiki-taka" system. Being fairly competitive is fine provided things don't go beyond arguments and escalate into foul play, bad tackles or violence. This is an informal setup with no definite rules or structure, so we rely on common sense, mutual respect, maturity and understanding. At the end of the day, we're just hoping to have fun, get some exercise and improve our game.

SCHEDULE: For the summer, we try to organize daily games at 7pm @Wilson Playfields or other locations in Kent based on availability of players and venues. Attendance is flexible via RSVP. Cleats, turf shoes or any suitable footwear works. All updates and communication are posted on the group.

OUR EXPECTATION: We're not necessarily looking for the best or most skillful players, nor trying to assemble a professional or highly competitive team; just folks who want to play and let play. So if you enjoy a more tactical medium-paced game that prioritizes passing and team involvement with controlled impact/intensity, this is for you. If you're over 30, have lost a couple yards of pace and/or had major injuries/surgeries (ACL/MCL reconstructions, Ruptured Achilles, etc.), you are an ideal fit. While there are several other teams that show up for impromptu games at Wilson Playfields and other neighborhood parks, it's usually unplanned, uncoordinated and extremely crowded often with way too many players in very close quarters. As you can imagine in this scenario, most people barely get a chance to play, few pro/semi-pro players dominate the game, many prefer excessive dribbling/individual showboating over passing to a teammate, and the risk of injuries are amplified through unnecessary rough play. That's why we're trying to get a smaller, more exclusive group together that understands and appreciates the value of a fulfilling soccer experience. As a collaborative community, we're evolving and always happy to incorporate suggestions on the format, schedule, rules, etc. or any constructive feedback that can help us be better. Questions? 
