One Spark Ignites Many: Join Us in Supporting SERES

Were you inspired by the talks by *Abigail Quic* and *Antonio Cruz Sánchez* at Mass last weekend about the work of *Social Equity, Resilience, and Ecological Stability (SERES)* in Central America? The St. John the Baptist companion parish in Guatemala, Union de las Aldeas de Cristo Rey, is working with *SERES* to empower its youth and young adults to make a difference in their communities. *SERES* is a homegrown non-profit organization that is based in Antigua, Guatemala and San Salvador, El Salvador. Our parish's mission team first focused on one particularly talented young woman, *Elisa Lopez*, who has recruited 15 young people into the program. Our parish has used existing mission funds to support *Elisa* and eventually will support her cohort.

Be the 'Safe' in Safe Car Parking

Our Safe Car Parking Program is looking for three (or more) volunteers to help provide the "safe" in safe car parking.

Since 2018, St. John the Baptist has supported eight guests, who sleep in their cars overnight in our parking lot. Our guests receive background checks and case management through *Catholic Community Services*.

Safe Car Parking volunteers work in pairs, taking a week every month to check our cameras overnight, log activity, staff the 24-hour phone line, and do a "drive through" to ensure that all is well in our parking lot. There is a monthly meeting on the first Tuesday. New volunteers will be paired with experienced volunteers.

The team is working on a grant to fund additional services through *Catholic Community Services*, including more intensive case management and cold weather motel stays. St. John the Baptist has witnessed the number of people served double over the last year. Please contact *Kathy Wickward* at the parish office for more information.

Test Your Mass Awareness

Last week's question was, "Why is the 'square cover' placed over the chalice?" Answer: before the offertory of the Mass, the chalice is covered with a square piece made of linen and stiffened with cardboard. This covering, called the pall (from the Latin word for "cover"), keeps foreign objects like dust or insects from falling into the chalice or onto the paten (the saucer-like circular dish) and contaminating them. In places where insecticides and air conditioning have greatly reduced the presence of insects during Mass, the use of the pall has greatly diminished. Back to Ministry: A Fall Planning Guide for Leaders

Most ministries take the summer off to allow members to enjoy vacation time with their families. While the time off is wonderful, it's often too short! Before long, it's time to start planning and scheduling regular ministry meetings for the year. Here's a helpful review of what ministry leaders need to do.

- Have a staff contact. Every parish group has a staff member assigned to help with things like scheduling rooms or answering questions. When a new leader takes office, be sure to let your staff contact know as soon as possible.
- Schedule and plan. Different groups have different needs. Keep in mind that youth events can be loud and active. Small faith groups may need quiet spaces. If the staff knows this ahead of time, rooms can be scheduled to accommodate the activity level of the group. Remember to always check the calendar for availability and potential conflicts before making plans. If you are unsure on how to do this, contact the office staff. Note that your event is not official until you receive confirmation from the staff.
- Keys, codes, and room use are intended for that specific meeting. While the staff is happy to provide keys and door codes to ministry leaders, these keys and codes are not a blanket permission for unplanned meetings. Every meeting that requires room use must be pre-approved by the office.
- All posters and flyers must be approved by the office before posting. All unapproved material will be taken down by the office.
- The use of the kitchen or multipurpose rooms requires a walk-through with David Aldous ahead of time. A checklist must be completed before leaving the event.

If your ministry needs space in the refrigerator or freezer for an event, please let *Rose McAvoy* at the office know when you submit your facilities request. She will add the appliance reservation to your request.

If you are reserving the entire kitchen, you don't need to request the refrigerator/freezer separately.

Faith Formation and funeral ministries do not need to be reserved for normal ongoing use. Reservations are only needed when there will be expanded use for special events.

- There is a protocol for **collecting money at events**. Please check with the office for more information.
- Be a good neighbor! Don't hang around the parking lot after dark and continue your party.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy *What About Bob?* Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for breakthrough "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness – rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life.
