Turning Generosity Into Nourishment



Backpack Buddies is a partnership between St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and Covington Elementary, our neighbor across the street. This program is a ministry within our parish that provides children at Covington Elementary with free and easy-to-prepare food to take home each weekend when school meal

programs are not available. The goal is to ensure that students, who are facing food insecurities at home, have consistent access to food to improve their energy, confidence, and academic performance. We are currently supporting 11 students, who have been identified by the school counselors, to receive weekend food bags. This number will fluctuate as enrollment and needs change.

We are in need of donations to help fill the backpacks. You can contribute in several ways:

• Shop our Amazon wish list (search for "2025-2026 Backpack Buddies for Covington Elementary") by clicking —Amazon, or by scanning the QR code. Items can be shipped directly to the parish office.



- Use your preferred online retailer and have your items shipped directly to the parish.
- Purchase items locally and place them in the bin by the Life, Justice, and Peace table in the narthex or bring them to the parish office.

This week, we especially need shelf-stable milk, BelVita breakfast bars, instant oatmeal packets, granola bars, and applesauce cups or pouches.

These bags are filled by the middle school faith formation students each week and delivered on Friday morning to Covington Elementary. These backpacks then go home on Friday afternoon with the children enrolled in the Backpack Buddies program.

Caring for Creation Inspired by St. Francis of Assisi

The Season of Creation 2025 is officially ending October 4 on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. However, care for our Planet Earth must be ongoing, extending to every day and season of the year. St. Francis of Assisi left a legacy of love for nature, not merely in an environmental view but deeply rooted with a spiritual reverence for creation and a call to stewardship.

In 1205, near the church of San Damiano in Assisi, St. Francis was led to pray before the image of the Crucifix. From the cross he heard a voice say three times, "Francis go and repair my church." He eventually realized that God's request was to spiritually restore the entire Catholic Church. It is inspiring that the fulfillment of that request led St. Francis to his spiritual reverence for creation. Care for God's Creation is one of the primary principles of Catholic social teaching. We are grateful to St. Francis for his example.

We will be honoring St. Francis of Assisi at all of our regular Sunday Masses with his statue placed in front of the ambo beside the crucifix - the same image before which he heard the call to repair the Church of San Damiano.

TRANSITION UPDATE

Hola Parish Family,

I wanted to give you an **update** on Partners in the Gospel. Across the Archdiocese and here in our own parish family, **good things are already happening!**

Archdiocesan Highlights

- Signs of Hope: Weekend Mass counts across the Archdiocese have grown 10% this year, with over 115,800 people coming together for worship. Mass is now celebrated in nine languages, a beautiful reminder of our diversity and unity in Christ.
- Listening to One Another: Parish Family Advisory Councils and Leadership Teams are guiding the process of "Who are we?" by looking at parish history, gifts, and ministries. Parishioner listening sessions are underway now through the end of the year; everyone is encouraged to share their voice.
- Caring for One Another: Through the Mission Essential Parish Family Fund, nearly \$300,000 in grants have supported parish families most in need. This is possible thanks to parishes, including St. John the Baptist, who contributed their ACA rebates and the generosity of many donors.

Local Progress

Here is where we are at:

- Step Two Completed: We have gathered valuable information about our current parish reality: viability metrics, the demographic survey, and parishioner feedback from August on "What do you love about your parish?" Those results will be shared soon.
- Step Three Ahead Listening Sessions: Soon, parishioners will be invited into small-group prayerful sessions led by trained volunteers. These gatherings are a chance to listen to one another and to discern together where the Holy Spirit is leading us. Your voice is vital; please plan to participate.
- Our Shared Mission: Together, among other things, we must restructure to:
 - Grow Mass attendance and welcome more people to encounter Christ.
 - Strengthen our outreach to the poor.
 - Foster vocations to the priesthood, marriage, and religious life.
 - Support our priests with a sustainable rhythm of ministry (our goal is three Sunday Masses per priest; at present I celebrate 4–6 just on Sunday, and up to 10 on the weekend! Doable for now, but not sustainable long-term).

Please continue to pray for this process and stay tuned for the announcement of local listening session dates. In the hope, faith, and love of Jesus, Padre Carlos.





ACTUALIZACIÓN DE TRANSICIÓN

Hola Familia Parroquial,

Quería darles una actualización sobre Compañeros en el Evangelio. En toda la Arquidiócesis y aquí en nuestra propia familia parroquial, ¡ya están sucediendo cosas buenas!

Aspectos destacados de la Arquidiócesis

- Señales de Esperanza: El número de misas de fin de semana en la Arquidiócesis ha aumentado un 10% este año, con más de 115,800 personas reunidas para el culto. La misa ahora se celebra en nueve idiomas, un hermoso recordatorio de nuestra diversidad y unidad en Cristo.
- Escuchando a los demás: Los Consejos Asesores de Familias Parroquiales y los Equipos de Liderazgo guían el proceso "¿Quiénes somos?" analizando la historia, los dones y los ministerios de la parroquia. Las sesiones de escucha para feligreses están en marcha desde ahora hasta fin de año; se anima a todos a compartir su opinión.
- Cuidándonos unos a otros: A través del Fondo Familiar Parroquial Esencial de la Misión, casi \$300,000 en subvenciones han apoyado a las familias parroquiales más necesitadas. Esto es posible gracias a parroquias como San Juan Bautista, que aportaron sus reembolsos de la Ley de Cuidado de Salud Asequible (ACA) y a la generosidad de numerosos donantes.

Progreso local

Aquí es donde estamos:

- Segundo paso completado: Hemos recopilado información valiosa sobre la realidad parroquial actual: indicadores de viabilidad, la encuesta demográfica y los comentarios de los feligreses de agosto sobre "¿Qué les gusta de su parroquia?". Compartiremos estos resultados próximamente.
- **Tercer paso:** Sesiones de escucha: Próximamente, los feligreses serán invitados a sesiones de oración en grupos pequeños dirigidas por voluntarios capacitados. Estas reuniones son una oportunidad para escucharnos unos a otros y discernir juntos hacia dónde nos guía el Espíritu Santo. Su voz es vital; por favor, planee participar.
- Nuestra misión compartida: Juntos, entre otras cosas, debemos reestructurarnos para:
 - Aumentar la asistencia a misa y dar la bienvenida a más personas para que encuentren a Cristo
 - Fortalecer nuestro alcance a los pobres
 - Fomentar las vocaciones al sacerdocio, al matrimonio y a la vida religiosa.
 - Apoyar a nuestros sacerdotes con un ritmo sostenible de ministerio (nuestra meta es de tres misas dominicales por sacerdote; actualmente celebro entre 4 y 6 los domingos, ¡y a veces hasta 10 en total del fin de semana! Es factible por ahora, pero no sostenible a largo plazo).

Por favor, sigan orando por este proceso y estén atentos al anuncio de las fechas de las sesiones de escucha locales. Con la esperanza, la fe y el amor de Jesús, Padre Carlos.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I am embarrassed to admit that I frequently find myself dining and socializing with people who have millions and sometimes billions of dollars. I've eaten more caviar, lobster and wagyu steak than most people on the planet. I justify it by saying it's part of my job. But I have seven pairs of nice jeans and expensive shoes.

So it is rather uncomfortable to hear Our Lord say: "My child, remember that you received what was good in your lifetime, while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented" (Luke 16:25). Fellow rich people (and if you're American, you're rich), do we not vehemently though quietly object to this parable's karma-esque reward system? Why bless the rich man just to curse him later? And curse Lazarus just to bless him later? So Americans go to hell, while Burundians and Afghans go to heaven? What is going on?

One clue is that the condemned rich man doesn't complain of injustice. Rather, he simply begs to help his brothers to repent. Of what? We don't know exactly. Perhaps another clue is that the rich man now seems more like the downtrodden Lazarus. He knows what it is to be hungry and thirsty, to be wounded in the gutter; that he deserved that, not fancy meals and clothes. Maybe the rich man finally understands how to receive true blessings, but it is too late for him. But not for me. Not for us.
