

Test Your Mass Awareness

Last week's question was, "What are the four parts of the priest's vestment?" Answer: 1) Alb (long white tunic); 2) Chasuble (outermost garment); 3) Cincture (cord around waist); and 4) Stole (drapes over the neck and shoulders). The alb signifies the grace received in baptism and is also a symbol of purity. The chasuble represents Christ's love and sacrifice, which cover all people. The cincture symbolizes chastity and purity. The stole is a symbol of the priest's authority and spiritual commitment.¹

Abigail Quic, a Tz'utujil woman from Guatemala, is Co-Executive Director of SERES and an alumna of its Transformative Sustainability Leadership program. She has led over 70 educational programs reaching 1,500+ youth across Central America, promoting climate resilience, gender equity, and indigenous leadership. Founder of the eco-social enterprise Casa Maya, Abigail has received national and international recognition, including the IMPULSA Award and the ITRI Visionary Young Leaders Award. She holds a degree in Human Resources Management and is a fellow of the Global Diversity Foundation, specializing in leadership, fundraising, and coaching. Over the past decade, Abigail has championed environmental education, reforestation campaigns, and youth empowerment in her community. She represents indigenous women globally in climate change dialogues and has spoken in forums in Germany, Thailand, and Costa Rica. At SERES, she mentors young leaders and facilitators, designing tools that integrate sustainability and indigenous knowledge to build resilient communities.

Antonio Cruz Sánchez, Co-Executive Director and co-founder of SERES, is a youth educator and anthropologist from rural El Salvador. With over 15 years of experience, he has led hundreds of programs across Guatemala and El Salvador, inspiring more than 2,500 young people to create sustainable, community-driven solutions. Antonio founded one of the first ecological committees in Suchitoto and has represented SERES in global events in the UK, Brazil, Colombia, and beyond. Trained in tourism, permaculture, and anthropology, Antonio combines academic knowledge with grassroots action to support the next generation of Central American leaders. He is a regional finalist for the UN Young Champions of the Earth Award and a key figure in SERES' expansion, joining Abigail Quic as Co-Executive Director in 2024. His work focuses on cultural resilience, environmental stewardship, and youth-led transformation.


