This is your Partners in the Gospel update for October 2025.

This month marks an important milestone: we are conducting our first Listening Sessions. There are two key questions we need your help to answer as we continue discerning where the Lord is leading our parish family.

- **First:** What challenges or obstacles might we encounter as we merge our two unique parishes into one family?
- Second: What opportunities do you see in combining our gifts and resources?

Before reflecting on those questions, we first took time to recognize the unique gifts that make each of our parishes special. A comprehensive list of all your comments will be made available once ready, but here is a summary of key themes you mentioned:

St. John the Baptist is a joyful and welcoming community where people of many cultures come together as one family of faith. 
Yarning for Community is holding their annual collection of hats, gloves, and scarves for those experiencing homelessness.


