Hundreds joined the Immigration Pilgrimage of Hope on October 4, 2025, walking from St. Leo Parish in Tacoma to the Northwest ICE Processing Center. The event, organized by the Archdiocese of Seattle and St. Leo Parish, concluded with a Mass celebrated outside the detention center in solidarity with immigrants.

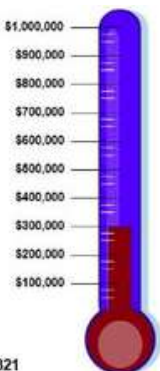

More Hands, More Grace

The *Liturgy Commission* is pleased to announce that beginning **Saturday, November 1**, there will be four cup ministers at every Mass. However not all Masses will be able to have four cups starting November 1. It will depend on how many Eucharistic Ministers (EMs) are available for that Mass.



For some time, only two cup ministers were scheduled due to a shortage of EMs. Thanks to growing attendance, new volunteers, and the return of many EMs who paused their ministry during COVID, we are now able to expand this important role at **most** Masses.

This change also helps ensure that our parishioners with disabilities will have the opportunity to receive both the Body and Blood of Christ.

We thank our EMs for their continued dedication in helping our parish encounter Christ in the Eucharist. If you feel called to serve as a EM, please contact the parish office to learn more about this beautiful ministry.

Backpack Buddies is a parish ministry of St. John the Baptist Parish, partnering with Covington Elementary to provide weekend meals for students facing food insecurity. Currently supporting 41 children, the program helps ensure that these children have consistent access to nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to boost their energy, confidence, and academic success.



We are in need of donations to help fill the backpacks. You can contribute in several ways:

Be the "Safe" in Safe Car Parking

Our Safe Car Parking Program is looking for three volunteers to help provide the "safe" in safe car parking.

Since 2018, St. John the Baptist has supported eight guests, who sleep in their cars overnight in our parking lot. Safe Car Parking volunteers work in pairs, taking a week every month to check our cameras overnight, log activity, staff the 24-hour phone line, and do a "drive through" to ensure that all is well in our parking lot. There is a monthly meeting on the first Tuesday. New volunteers will be paired with experienced volunteers.

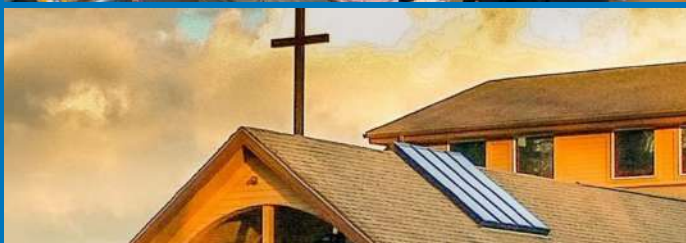

Ecclesiastes reminds us that “there is a time for everything under the sun.” The changing season of autumn beautifully coincides with the close of our liturgical year!

Throughout this past year, we have reflected on the Gospel of Luke and deepened our understanding of the Church as **the sacrament of union with God and of unity among all people**.

As the **new liturgical year** begins this Advent (at the end of November), we will turn to the Gospel of Matthew. The main theme for the coming year will be “**The Kingdom of Heaven**.” I look forward to unfolding this theme in the months ahead. As you know, I’m a creative type, and inspiration for us artists often comes in bursts! I expect this theme to weave its way through many of our upcoming celebrations: Día de los Muertos, All Saints, All Souls, Our Lady of Guadalupe, Advent, and this year’s Nativity scene.

Staff Updates: Please join me in welcoming Joseph (Joe) Holien, our new Facilities Supervisor for both parishes. His role will help streamline maintenance and facilities needs across our two sites, easing the workload for Kathy and Kristi.

As Partners in the Gospel continues to open new opportunities for shared ministry, we now have several shared staff members: Veronica in youth ministry and Joe in facilities. This collaboration helps us live our parish family mission more efficiently and unitedly.

St. John the Baptist: A visible sanctuary light is coming soon! A few months ago, I mentioned the importance of making our worship space more visibly Catholic. After many fruitful conversations with parishioners, staff, and our liturgy commission, we found a thoughtful way to do that while honoring our parish’s unique tradition. Visitors often mention having trouble locating the tabernacle; a hanging red sanctuary lamp will now make it more visible, drawing the eye to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Thank you to everyone who shared feedback and ideas.

Cultural Celebrations: As the season of cultural celebrations begins, our parishes will come alive with many expressions of faith, from Simbang Gabi to Our Lady of Guadalupe. I warmly invite you to participate in any celebration, in any language. Even when we don’t understand every word, we experience the beauty of our universal faith and the richness of our diverse parish family.

May this final stretch of the liturgical year be filled with grace as we prepare our hearts for Advent. With blessings and gratitude,

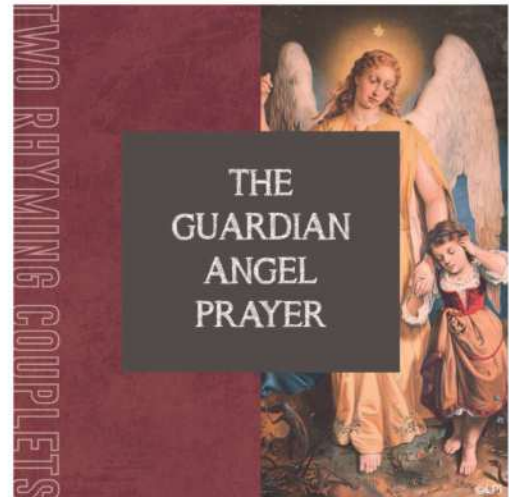
