

On that joyful day, families from our own St. John the Baptist community, many of whom feared Christmas might not happen for them this year, will be invited to shop for toys and gifts for their entire family.

If Christmas feels overwhelming or hopeless this year, and you need a little help with gifts, we warmly invite you to stop by the narthex, fill out a form, and drop it in the collection box.

This year, the Giving Tree team is excited to bring back two long-time favorites that weren't available last year: queen-size blankets and laundry detergent. How to review and update your recurring gift:

- · Log in to your Pushpay account at PushPay.com.
- Under "Scheduled Gifts" review each gift to ensure the giving schedule does not overlap, which creates a duplicate gift.
- If necessary, add an end date to an existing gift:
 - select the recurring gift you want to edit
 - click "edit" and adjust the "end date" to your desired date
- IMPORTANT Save your changes!



PARTNERS IN THE GOSPEL UPDATE

The process of Partners in the Gospel continues throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle.

A Quick Reminder

Partners in the Gospel is our archdiocesan response to a simple reality: we do not have enough priests to serve every parish individually. Because of this, parishes have been grouped into parish families under the leadership of a single pastor. Over time, each parish family will become one canonical parish, that is, one parish in Church law, with one pastor, one set of councils and finances, and a shared vision, even if we continue to worship at more than one church site. The goal is to renew our commitment to the mission the Church, evangelization and service.

What Have We Done So Far?

- 2024: Organization and kickoff. Parish family and priest assignments were announced. Parishes began getting to know one another through shared events and ministries. Consultative groups were formed (PFLT and PFAC).
- May 2025: Demographic Survey and Metrics of Viability. We conducted a survey to see who is currently attending Mass with us. We also received a report from the archdiocese regarding our current space usage, finances, and Mass/Priests ratio. These reports where made available through the bulletin, and can be found in our websites.
- August 2025: "Who are we?" Parishioners shared what they most loved about their parish. A summary of this report is available in the bulletin insert, and the full report is on our parish websites.

As immediate needs arose, some changes to staffing, youth programming, and weekday Mass times have already been implemented.

Where Are We Right Now?

• October 2025: The first round of listening sessions took place, addressing the question, "What are the challenges and opportunities?"

 November and December 2025: The report from this session is currently being compiled. Once completed, it will be made available, and planning for the next round of listening sessions is underway.

What Is Next? (Dates are approximate targets.)

- **Early 2026**: Second round of listening sessions, discerning "Who do we want to become?"
- **Spring and Summer 2026**: Third round of listening sessions, discerning "How do we get there?"
- Summer and Fall 2026: Fourth round of listening sessions, discerning "What should we be called?"
- January to June 2027: This vision will be reviewed by our PFLT and PFAC teams and ultimately approved by me, your pastor. It will become a document called the One Parish Plan. This plan will describe how we will live as one canonical parish, with shared leadership, resources, and mission, while continuing to honor the unique gifts and traditions of each community. We will submit this plan to the Archbishop for review. Once it is approved, we will begin implementing the major changes that flow from our shared discernment.

SPANISH ON REVERSE

ACTUALIZACIÓN DE COMPAÑEROS EN EL EVANGELIO

El proceso de Socios en el Evangelio continúa en toda la Arquidiócesis de Seattle.

Un breve recordatorio

«Compañeros en el Evangelio» es la respuesta de nuestra arquidiócesis a una realidad innegable: no contamos con suficientes sacerdotes para atender a cada parroquia individualmente. Por ello, las parroquias se han agrupado en familias parroquiales bajo la dirección de un solo párroco. Con el tiempo, cada familia parroquial se convertirá en una sola parroquia canónica, es decir, una sola parroquia según el derecho canónico, con un solo párroco, un solo consejo parroquial, una sola administración y una sola visión compartida, aunque continuemos celebrando cultos en más de un templo. El objetivo es renovar nuestro compromiso con la misión de la Iglesia: la evangelización y el servicio.

¿Qué hemos hecho hasta ahora?

- 2024: Organización e inicio. Se anunciaron las asignaciones de familias parroquiales y sacerdotes. Las parroquias comenzaron a conocerse a través de eventos y ministerios compartidos. Se formaron grupos consultivos (PFLT y PFAC).
- Mayo de 2025: Estudio demográfico y métricas de viabilidad. Realizamos un estudio para conocer quiénes asisten actualmente a misa con nosotros. También recibimos un informe de la arquidiócesis sobre el uso actual del espacio, las finanzas y la proporción de misas por sacerdote. Estos informes se publicaron en el boletín parroquial y pueden consultarse en nuestros sitios web.
- Agosto de 2025: «¿Quiénes somos?» Los feligreses compartieron lo que más les gustaba de su parroquia. Un resumen de este informe está disponible en el boletín parroquial y el informe completo se encuentra en los sitios web de nuestras parroquias.

A medida que surgieron necesidades inmediatas, ya se han implementado algunos cambios en la plantilla, los programas para jóvenes y los horarios de misa entre semana.

¿Dónde nos encontramos ahora mismo?

- Octubre de 2025: Se celebró la primera ronda de sesiones de escucha, en las que se abordó la pregunta: "¿Cuáles son los retos y las oportunidades?".
- **Noviembre y diciembre de 2025**: Actualmente se está elaborando el informe de esta sesión. Una vez finalizado, estará disponible y ya se está planificando la próxima ronda de sesiones de escucha.

¿Qué sigue? (Las fechas son aproximadas).

- **Principios de 2026**: Segunda ronda de sesiones de escucha para discernir "¿En quiénes queremos convertirnos?".
- Primavera y verano de 2026: Tercera ronda de sesiones de escucha para discernir "¿Cómo llegamos allí?"
- Verano y otoño de 2026: Cuarta ronda de sesiones de escucha para discernir "¿Cómo deberíamos llamarnos?".
- De enero a junio de 2027: Esta visión será revisada por nuestros equipos de PFLT y PFAC y, finalmente, aprobada por mí, su párroco. Se convertirá en un documento llamado Plan Parroquial Único. Este plan describirá cómo viviremos como una sola parroquia canónica, con liderazgo, recursos y misión compartidos, a la vez que continuamos honrando los dones y tradiciones únicos de cada comunidad. Presentaremos este plan al Arzobispo para su revisión. Una vez aprobado, comenzaremos a implementar los cambios principales que surjan de nuestro discernimiento conjunto.

- Lo que compartes se está escribiendo, se está reflexionando sobre ello en oración y ayudará a guiar el futuro de nuestra familia parroquial.
- Si ya has participado, te invito a continuar.
- Si aún no has participado y te gustaría hacerlo, las próximas sesiones de escucha te brindarán esa oportunidad.
- Si prefieres no participar directamente, no hay ningún problema. Tus oraciones y apoyo son una parte real e importante de este camino.

Estoy profundamente agradecido a todo nuestro personal, voluntarios y feligreses que han participado en esta importante labor. Sigamos mirando al futuro con esperanza y confianza.




