Christmas at St. John the Baptist is a joyful time - filled with familiar faces, visiting family, and many guests. To help us extend a warm welcome, **please consider sitting closer to the front and sliding toward the center of the pew**. Leaving space at the aisle ends and toward the back makes it easier for newcomers to find a seat, especially if they arrive a little late or have children in tow. To help everyone find a place, we ask that you **please refrain from reserving multiple seats** for late arrivals.

Also, please **avoid standing in the narthex during services**. It may feel like a helpful option when seating is tight, but it violates fire code capacity and creates safety concerns.

We expect several hundred worshippers, especially at the 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm Masses. **If you arrive later, please plan on parking in the lot across the street**. Your cooperation helps us welcome everyone smoothly and safely during this joyful celebration.




